Departmental Accessibility Enhancements

As the first Accessibility Enhancements Annual Report, some of the facility, service, program, and activity enhancements listed may have been in place prior to the fiscal year. Accessibility enhancements are anything ranging from updating materials for translation to physical building construction enhancements.
