One of the CLERB members asked about training on mental health. I thought she might like to see the breakdown on training provided to Detentions/Courts Deputies and Law Enforcement Deputies on mental health.

The Detentions and Court Services Academy Cadets will complete the following training before graduating.

Cadets will receive training on basic definitions relating to disabilities from the BSCC Title 15 & 24, California Code of Regulations, Minimum Standards for Local Facilities.

Extra courses, if available:

PERT Crisis Intervention Behavioral Health Training (8 hrs) Crisis Intervention Training - PERT Academy (24 hrs)

Non-sworn mental health professionals attend mandatory, continued education as per their state license requirements.

Paul,

In response to the potential inquiry ref monkeypox you can forward this to CLERB.

Good morning, "Monkeypox is a zoonotic infection, caused by an orthopox virus endemic to Africa. The CDC is currently tracking an outbreak of monkeypox that has spread across several countries. As of August 3rd, there are 826 reported cases in the state of California. There are 54 potential cases in San Diego County; unknown how many cases have actually been confirmed. There are no known cases of monkeypox in any of San Diego County Jail facilities.

The San Diego Sheriff's Department Detentions Services Bureau (DSB) is aware of the proclaimed state of emergency initiated by Governor Newsom on 08/01/2022. We fully understand this proclamation, and have been proactive in working with our colleagues in Health and Human Services (HHSA) to prepare for a potential outbreak. We have educated our providers and clinicians to enhance awareness of the illness and to be vigilant for any signs or symptoms of the virus. If a newly incarcerated individual or longstanding resident demonstrates any signs or symptoms of a potential infection, they will be isolated, medically evaluated and treated accordingly. We are dedicated to the health and welfare of all those entrusted to our care.
