The Political Reform Act, Government Code Section 81000 et seq, requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission ("FPPC") has adopted a regulation, California Code of Regulations, Title 2, division 6, Section 18730 (hereinafter "CCR 18730"), which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. It can be incorporated by reference and may be amended by the FPPC after public notice and hearings to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act.

Therefore, the terms of CCR 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the FPPC are hereby incorporated by reference and along with the attached Appendix in which members and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth constitute the conflict of interest code of the County of San Diego Independent Redistricting Commission (hereinafter, the "Commission".)

Designated employees shall file statements of economic interests with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors. The statements filed are public records and shall be made available for public inspection and reproduction during regular business hours. (Gov. Code 81008.)



DISCLOSURE SCHEDULES

A-1, A-2, B, C, D, E

Consultants are included in the list of designated employees and are required to disclose pursuant to the broadest category in the code, subject to the following limitation: the County of San Diego Executive Lead for the Independent Redistricting Commission may determine, in writing, that a particular consultant, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that are limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements described in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and, based upon that description, a



statement of the extent of the disclosure requirements. The Executive Lead's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code.

Designated positions must report financial interests as applicable on Schedules A-1, A-2, B, C, D, & E of the Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700).
