Units are comprised of Auxiliary Communications Service (ACS), Citizen Volunteers, Mounted, Chaplains, Explorers, Senior Volunteer Patrol (SVP), Search & Rescue (SAR) & Law Enforcement Reserves. SVP and Mounted assist patrol deputies with extra patrols, traffic/scene control, evidence runs, vehicle maintenance, special events, foot patrols and other community events. Service by volunteers free deputies to respond to emergency calls for service. SVP also man and transport mobile command buses, crucial during large crime scenes, homicides, critical incidents, and officer involved shootings. Additionally, SVP conduct vacation checks and conduct thousands of phone calls and visits to our homebound and elderly citizens through the YANA Program (You Are Not Alone). Citizen volunteers are assigned to administrative posts and assist professional staff and investigative units with a variety of clerical duties. Several volunteers work the front desk at patrol stations. Explorers work with patrol deputies in the field and assist them with non-emergency radio calls. Explorers are valuable during parades, community fairs, and other events requiring traffic control. Chaplains work with Sheriff employees in all areas of the department. They are available for counseling, spiritual mentoring and stress management. Chaplains respond to all critical incidents and ride with deputies in the field on a routine basis. Search and Rescue personnel conduct search and rescue missions involving lost/stranded persons within the unincorporated areas of the county, contract cities, and are a county-wide resource available to any jurisdiction within the county. SAR activates for natural disasters such as wildfires, flooding, earthquakes and mud slides. Law Enforcement Reserve Deputies are a group of Volunteer Deputy Sheriffs with the same training and enforcement authority of a paid Deputy Sheriff and are used to supplement patrol Deputies. Specialized Reserve Teams with specific equipment and training expertise
