Types of work performed by GENERAL VOLUNTEERS in this category:

There are three primary groups of volunteers which are the Dog Pals, Cat Crew and Bunny Buddies. Volunteers in these groups are trained and mentored on how to safely interact and engage with the animals. Volunteers provide enrichment to animals throughout the day. Volunteers also give much needed help with daily tasks at the shelter. We also have a group of volunteers that help greet customers, wash dishes, do laundry, and clean the kennels.

DAS Fosters are a part of our general volunteer program. Fosters become a bridge between the shelter and a home environment taking animals home until permanent placement is found or until weight and age limits are met. DAS placed 361 animals in foster care in fiscal year 2022-2023.

#### 6. **RECRUITING:**

Please describe your recruiting programs:

In fiscal year 2022-2023, DAS held 29 New Volunteer and Foster Orientations to recruit Dog Pals, Cat Crew and Fosters. The volunteer program grew from 177-285 trained and active volunteers. The recruitment efforts were primarily through the Department's website and referrals from other volunteers. Shelter volunteers were interviewed, attended volunteer orientation, and started the training needed for the volunteer position. Fosters attended an online orientation and came into the shelter for a matching appointment.

### 7. SPECIAL VOLUNTEER PROGRAM ACTIVITIES/ACHIEVEMENTS:

Please describe any special activities and/or achievements your program was involved in during the period of this report:

The number of Shelter Volunteers increased from 105 to 201 in fiscal year 2022-23.

Beacons North County recognized the Department of Animal Services for our dedication to providing volunteer opportunities and job readiness skills to the neurodiverse community in San Diego. DAS is the only organization in the county that allows adults with special needs to have direct contact with animals. DAS works with 14 different organizations and 33 adults.

DAS provided disaster planning and education to rural communities through 5 SDGE Wildfire Safety Fairs engaging both staff and volunteers.

DAS held specialized training for volunteers to conduct interacts with the public and to facilitate play pairs with dogs housed at the shelters.
