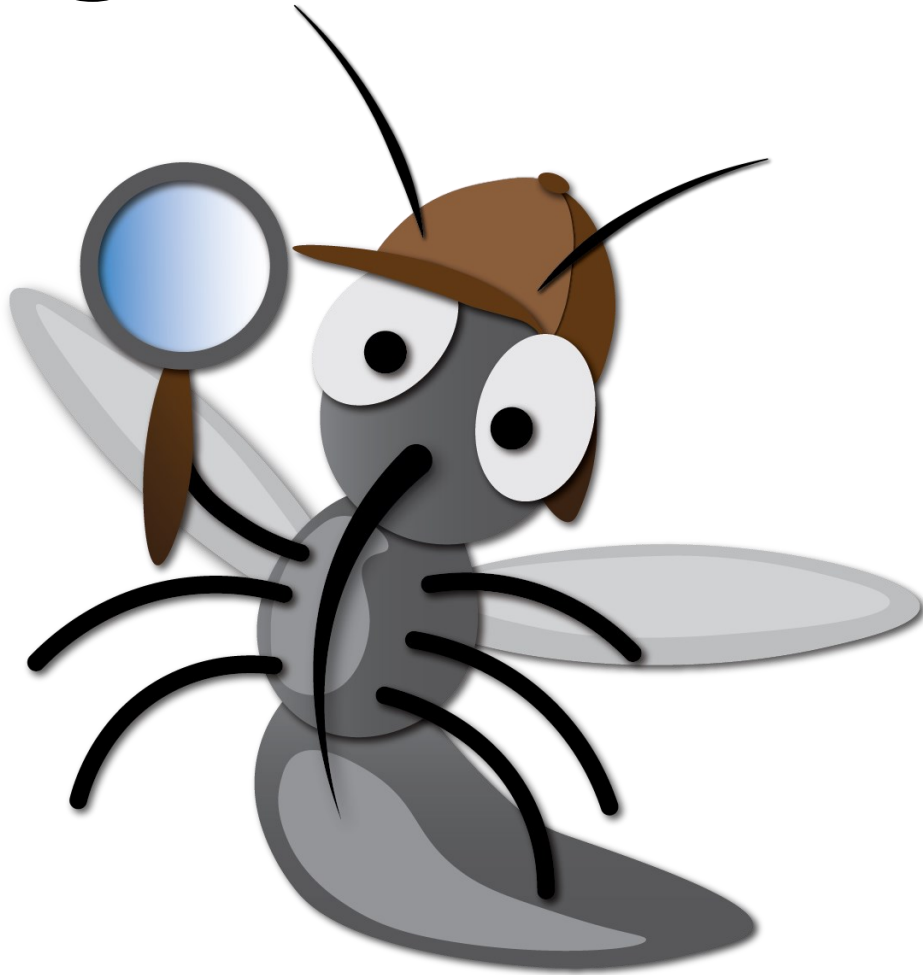

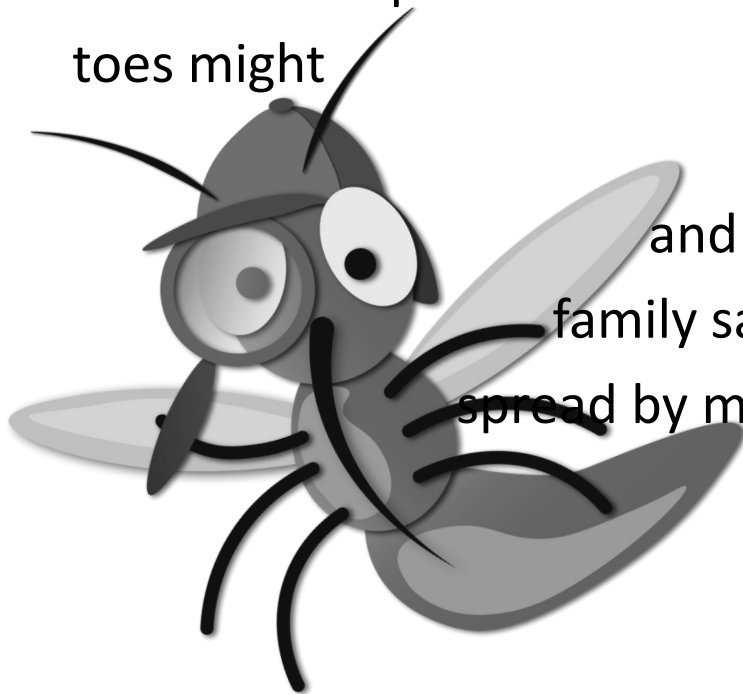


We need your help!

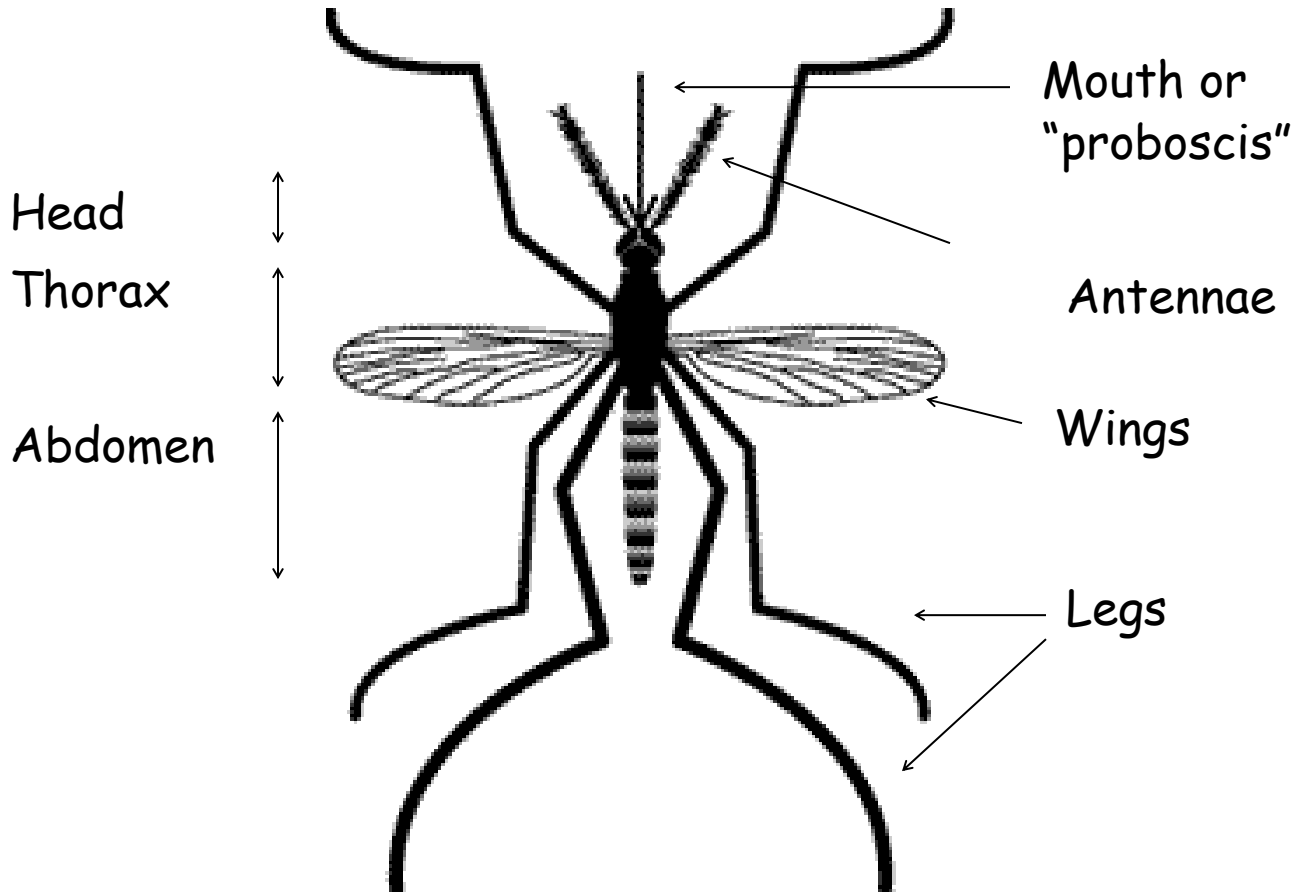


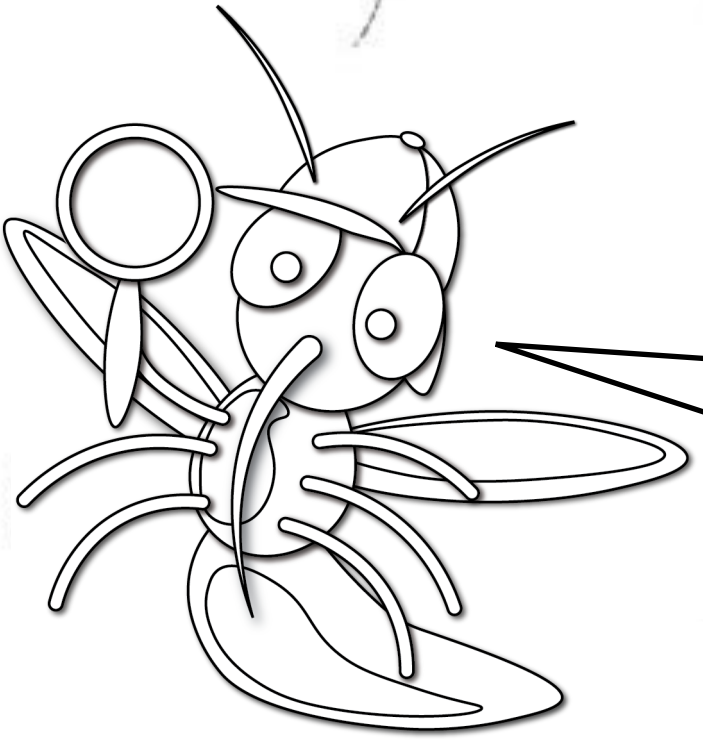
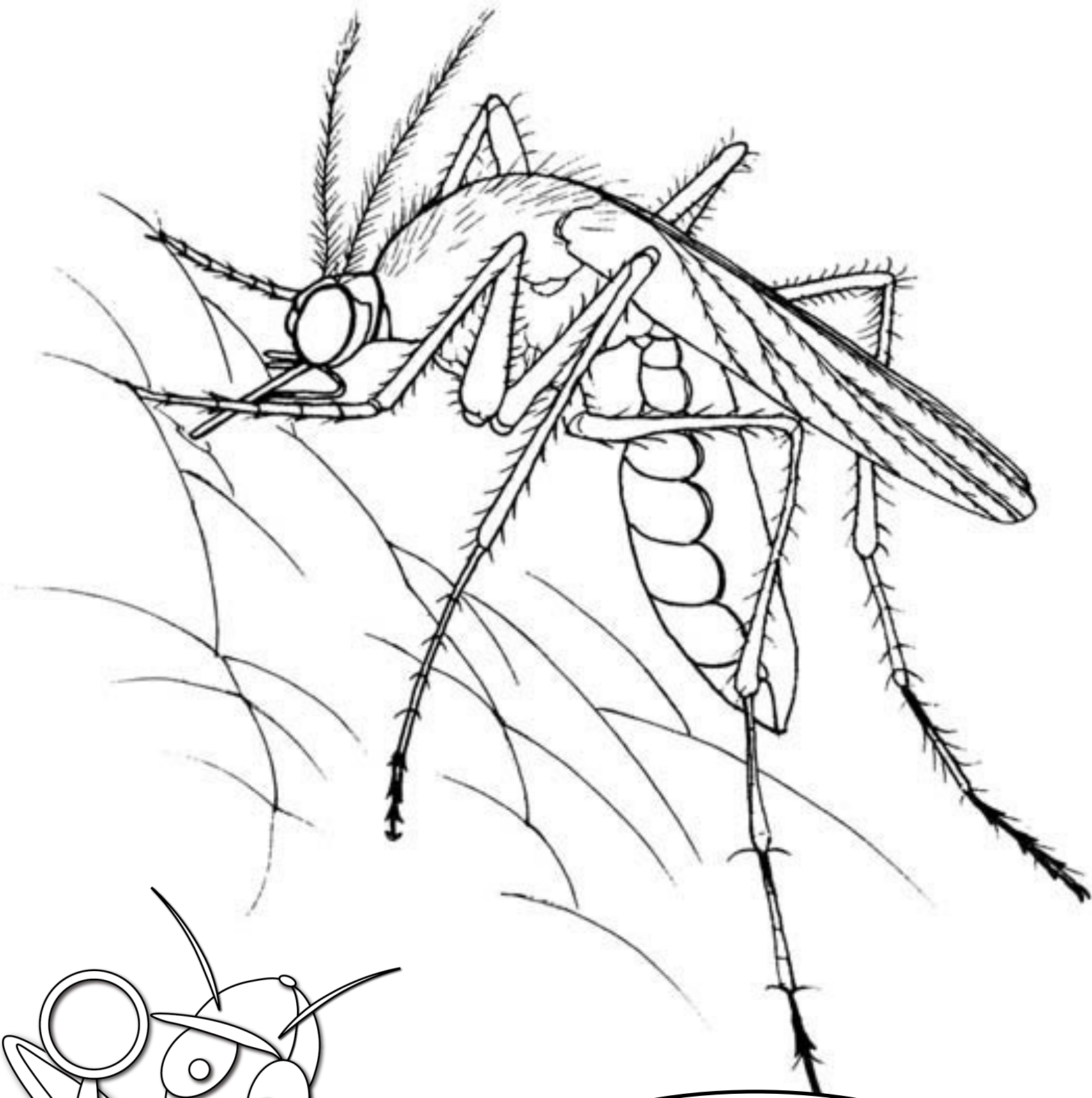
and how to keep your family safe from diseases spread by mosquitoes.

What is a Mosquito?

Mosquitoes are insects. This means they have no backbone and are divided into three parts: the head, the thorax, and the abdomen. The head has eyes, a mouth, and one pair of antennae. The mouth is long like a needle. It is called the proboscis. This is how female mosquitoes can bite animals through skin to get blood. The thorax has three pairs of legs and usually one pair of wings. The abdomen contains the guts and reproductive organs.

Mosquito Anatomy

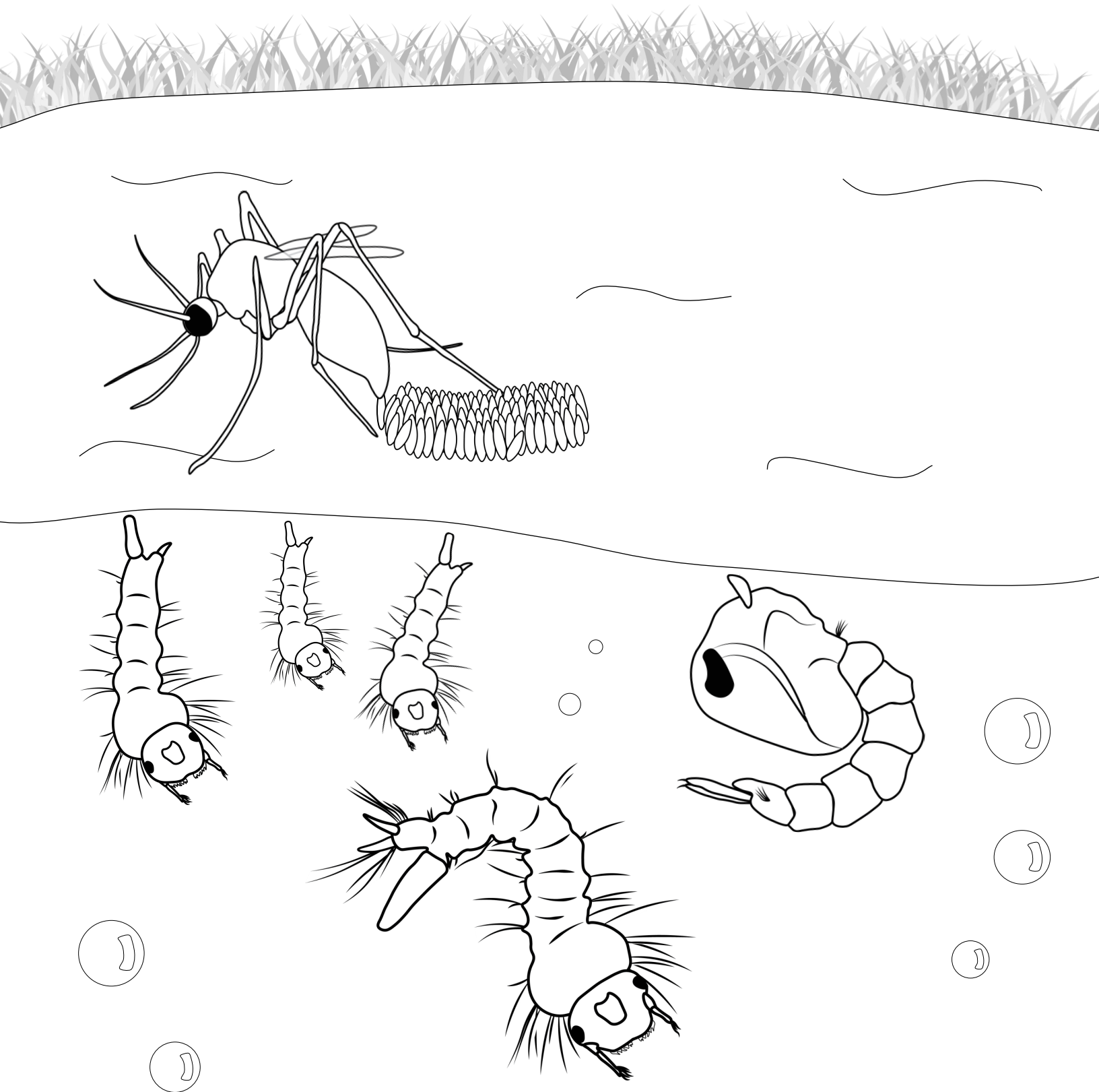




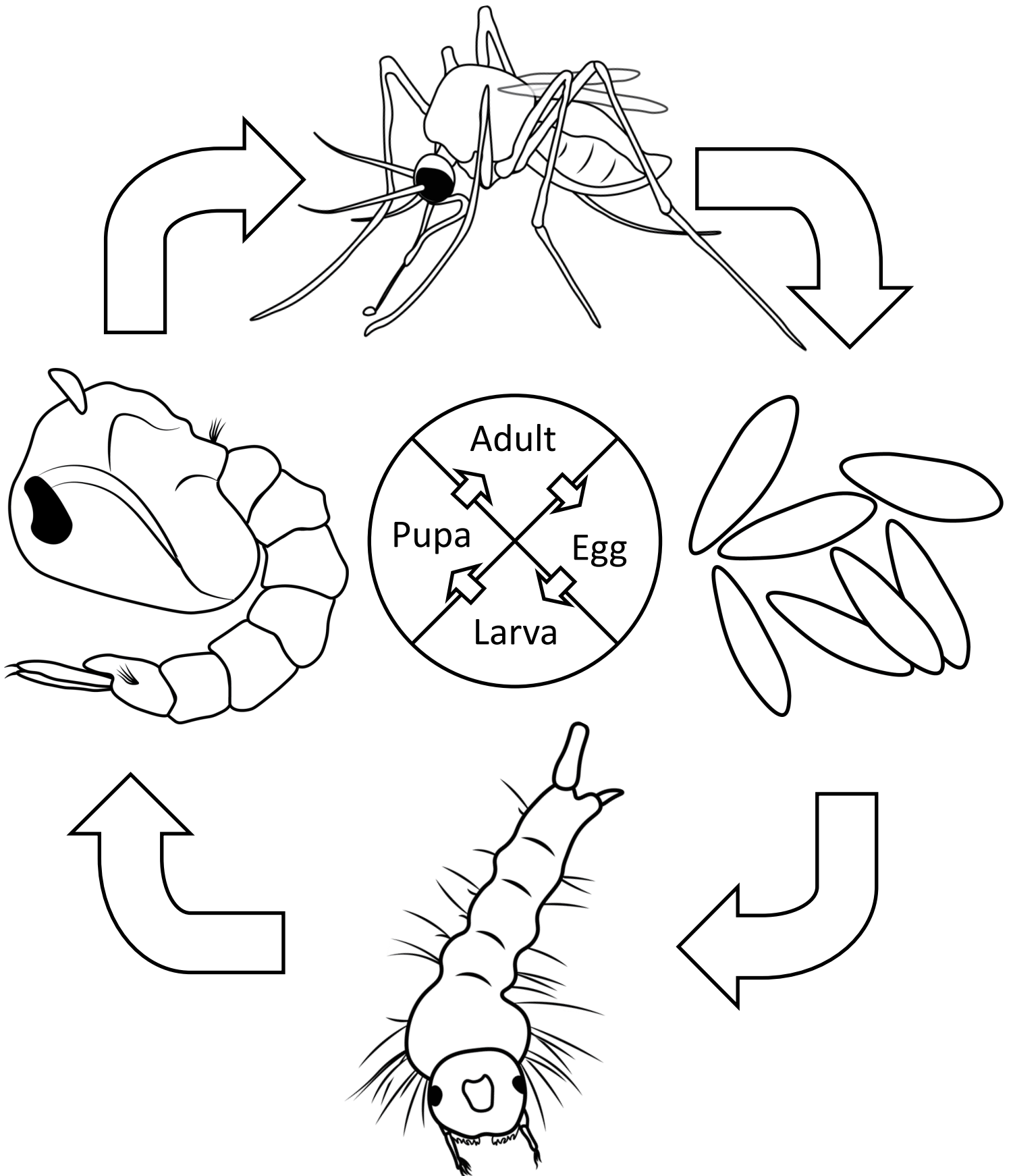

Mosquito Bites

- Only female mosquitoes bite people and drink blood. They need the nutrients in our blood in order to lay eggs.
- When a mosquito bites you to drink your blood, she injects her saliva into you.
- Mosquito saliva is an anti-coagulant, which stops our blood from clotting, making it easier for the mosquito to drink it up.
- When a mosquito bites your skin, you may get an itchy bump. Most of us are allergic to mosquito saliva. That's why mosquito bites itch!

Mosquitoes can make us sick by spreading viruses in their saliva!



Culex mosquitoes

- Like to bite at dusk and dawn
- Bite birds and people
- Can spread West Nile virus



Aedes mosquitoes

- Like to bite during the day
- Bite around your ankles
- Bite mostly people
- Can spread Zika, dengue, & yellow fever viruses

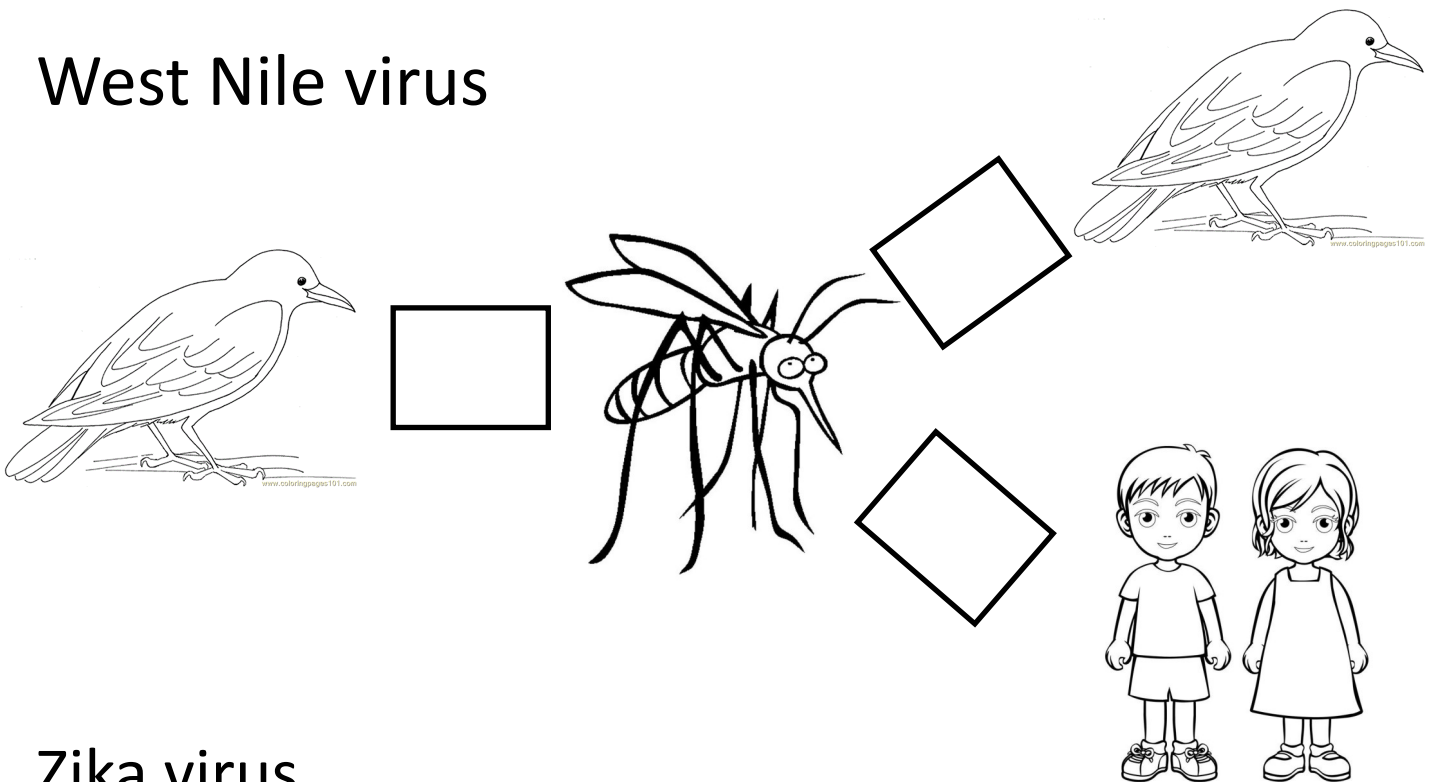
Mosquito Diseases

Mosquitoes that have bitten an infected person or animal can spread that disease to the people it bites next! West Nile virus, Zika, dengue, and yellow fever are all diseases mosquitoes can spread. West Nile is spread from birds to people by mosquitoes. Zika, dengue, and yellow fever are spread between people by mosquitoes.

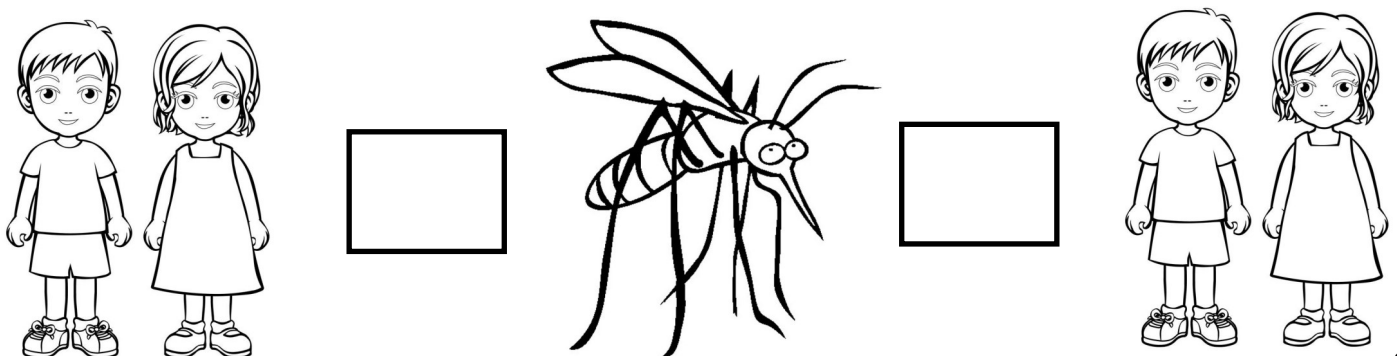

Mosquito Repellent

Mosquito repellent is sprayed or wiped on skin to keep mosquitoes away and prevent bites. Insect repellents with the active ingredients DEET, Picaridin, IR3535, or Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus are the best at repelling mosquitoes.

Bromeliads



A bromeliad is a type of plant that many people keep inside and outside of their homes. Bromeliads collect water between their leaves. This makes them a natural place for mosquitoes to lay their eggs.

Dump or flush out this water once a week to prevent mosquitoes!

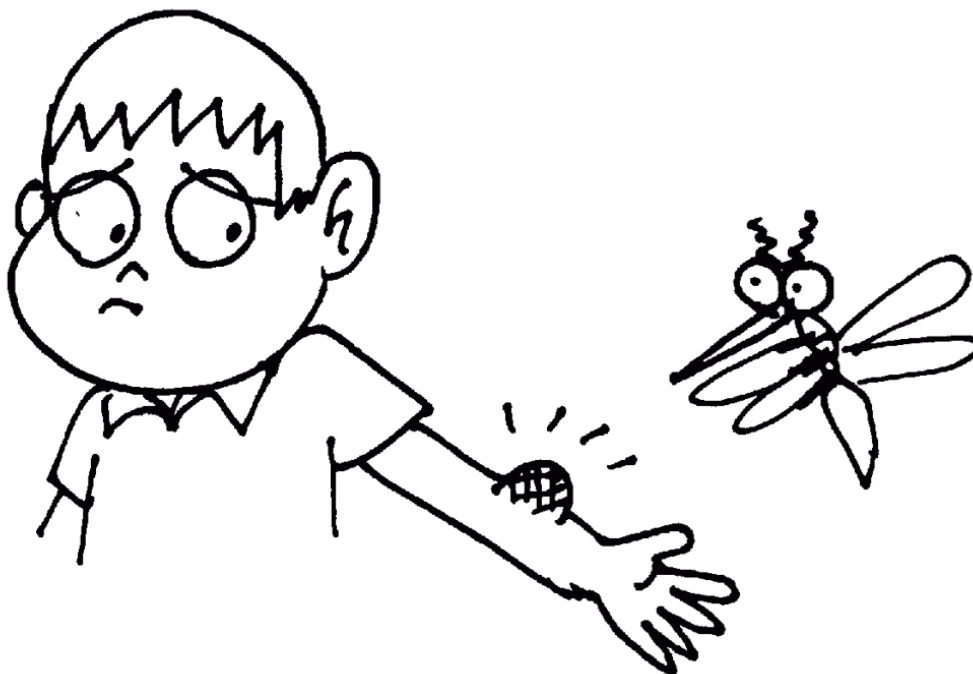

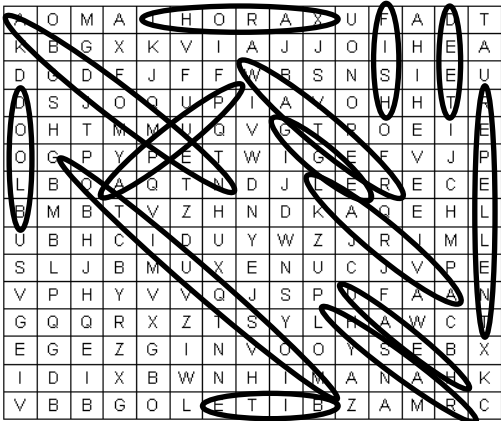

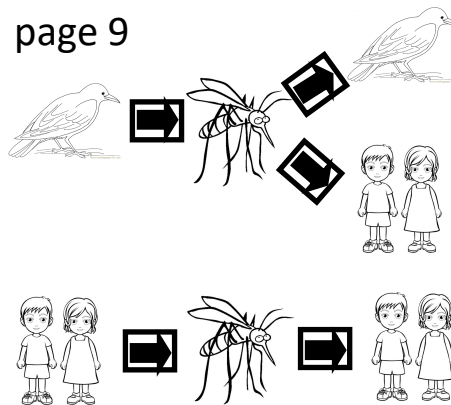
- Adults can report green pools and other mosquito breeding sources in their neighborhood to the Vector Control Program by calling (858) 694-2888
- Mosquito fish to control mosquito larvae in ponds and pools are available free of charge from the Vector Control Program.
- Mosquito larvae (in ponds, pools, fountains, rain barrels, etc.) can also be controlled by using mosquito larvicide products (available in dunks, granules, and liquid forms)

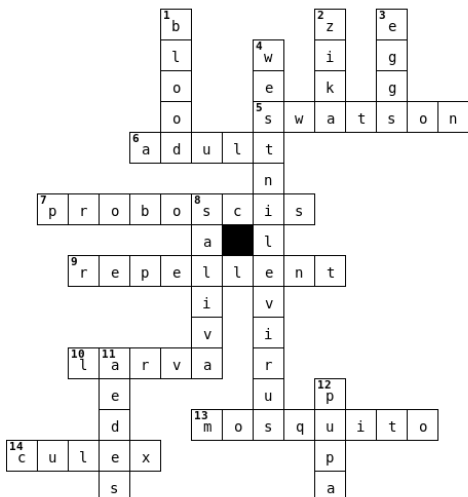

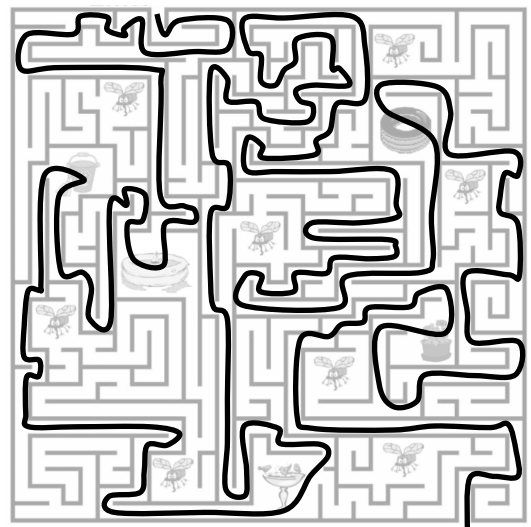
