## What is the California Environmental Quality Act or CEQA?

- ♦ State law implemented in 1970
- ♦ One of California's most important environmental laws, requiring consideration of environmental consequences of proposed projects
- ◆ Applies to projects subject to discretionary approval by a California state or local government agency

## What is the Purpose of CEQA?

- ◆ Inform government agency decisionmakers and the public of potential environmental consequences of a project, and disclose reasons for approval if adverse impacts may occur
- ◆ Identify ways to avoid, minimize, and prevent environmental impacts of projects through alternatives or mitigation
- ◆ Encourage public and agency participation and feedback on proposed projects, potential impacts, and avoidance or mitigation measures

#### What is the Role of the Public?

- ◆ Public involvement is key to the CEQA process
- ★ The public is encouraged to:
  - Participate during the public review period to provide feedback on the proposed project
  - Comment on the adequacy of environmental documents
  - Inform project design, alternatives, and avoidance and mitigation measures


### **Key CEQA Terms**

- ◆ **Project** = an activity with the potential to result in a direct or indirect change in the environment
- ◆ Lead Agency = public agency that has principal responsibility for carrying out or approving a project
- ◆ **Discretionary Action** = actions that require judgement or consideration prior to approval by a public agency
- ◆ Exemption = types of projects determined to be exempt from CEQA
  - Categorical Exemption = applicable to classes of projects determined not have an impact on the environment
  - Statutory Exemption = applicable to projects that are exempted from CEQA by the State Legislature
- ◆ Initial Study = analysis by a Lead Agency to determine what level of review will be required based on potential environmental impacts associated with a proposed project
- ♦ Mitigation = requirement(s) placed on a project to reduce or eliminate environmental impacts
- ◆ Negative Declaration (ND) = a document describing the reasons a project will not result in significant effects on the environment
- ♦ Mitigated ND (MND) = same as ND, but includes measures for avoiding or mitigating otherwise significant effects on the environment
- ◆ Environmental Impact Report (EIR) = a document informing public and policymakers of significant environmental effects of a proposed project and ways to minimize those effects, and to evaluate project alternatives
