

OWNER OPERATOR



- County of San Diego owns approximately 255 acres designated as the McClellan-Palomar Airport within Carlsbad City limits
- Managed and operated by the County of San Diego as a commercial airport it also serves as a major general aviation facility

PROGRAM MANAGEMENT MEASURES

 County airports has no aviation operating jurisdiction or authority other than the federal authorizations, regulations, and standards of the FAA
