Meeting Summary

1. QUORUM

The Chair determined that quorum was met and called the meeting to order.

2. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Jurisdiction representatives and guests introduced themselves.

3. REVIEW OF THE JUNE 2, 2021 MEETING SUMMARY

Heather Heckman, City of Santee motioned to approve the June 2, 2021 Meeting Summary. Jeanne Patton, City of San Diego seconded. <u>Motion carried</u> to approve the Meeting Summary.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Mallika Sen, Solana Center: The Solana Center in partnership with Urban Corps of San Diego diverted 2.2 tons of e-waste per month during the 9-month period the program was open in 2020.

The Solana Center in partnership with the County have installed 3 demonstration sites with potential capacity to divert 650 tons of organic material per year which translates to reducing emissions of approximately 189 MTCO₂/yr. Solana Center supported the County with organic waste diversion at a 2-day special event in Jamul that included an outreach booth to food vendors and a composting class. The event resulted in 158 pounds of organic waste that was composted onsite. For more information, please contact Mallika Sen at Mallika.Sen@solanacenter.org.

Allison Schlick, Zero Waste San Diego: Zero Waste San Diego is hosting a FixIt Clinic at the Solana Center on August 14. Registration information is available <u>here</u>. Zero Waste USA will be conducting a <u>training course on zero waste in Spanish</u>.

5. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Eric Wolff, County of San Diego: The County will be providing an overview of SB 1383 jurisdiction due dates for County reporting at a future meeting or via email.

6. CPSC UPDATE

Doug Kobold, California Product Stewardship Council (CPSC): A legislative update on the following bills was shared:

- <u>AB 1</u>, Hazardous Waste. 2-year bill
- <u>AB 246</u>, Contractors: disciplinary actions. Enrolled June 25, 2021
- <u>AB 332</u>, Hazardous waste: treated wood waste: management standards. In Senate Appropriations on Consent.
- <u>AB 707</u>, Mercury Thermostat Collection Act of 2021. Hearing Set in Senate Environmental Quality on July 12.
- **<u>SB 38</u>**, Beverage Containers. In Assembly Natural Resources
- <u>SB 158</u>, Hazardous waste. Enrolled June 29.
- <u>SB 244</u>, Lithium-ion batteries: illegal disposal: fire prevention. In Assembly Natural Resources on Consent.
- <u>SB 619</u>, Organic waste: reduction regulations. In Assembly Appropriations.

An update on regulations was shared:

- <u>SB 1335 proposed regulations</u> were approved by CalRecycle on December 31, 2020. CalRecycle is preparing final package for submittal to OAL.
- SB 212- Stewardship plans for pharmaceutical and sharps waste are due to CalRecycle on July 7, 2021. Two organizations have indicated that they will be submitting plans. 7. PRESENTATIONS

Tyler Douthitt, Mattress Recycling Council: The <u>Mattress Recycling Council</u> (MRC) is an industry led nonprofit organization funded by a visible recycling fee to operate mattress

recycling programs, conduct research, and combat illegal dumping. MRC currently has 10 recycling facilities in California and more than 200 permanent collection sites- 7 of which are in San Diego County. To find a collection center nearest you visit <u>byebyemattress.com</u>. To date, MRC has collected over 7 million mattress and has diverted 230 million pounds of material from the landfill. In effort to combat illegal dumping MRC established the Illegally Dumped Mattress Collection Initiative (IDMCI) to engage with local communities, address hot spots of illegal dumping and fund special projects. Entities that remove illegally dumped mattresses and box springs from the public right-of-way are eligible to participate. MRC also offers a commercial volume program that provides no-cost transportation for more than 100 units. 8. CALRECYCLE UPDATE

Roberta Goldenpenny, CalRecycle, reported on the following:

- CalRecycle published the SB 1383 webpage for <u>Elected Officials</u> to provide a high level summary of the regulatory requirements with an emphasis on how jurisdictions need to plan for implementation.
- The SB 1383 Organic waste recycling capacity planning calculator is available on their <u>webpage</u>.
- SB 1383 planned tools and resources include the implementation record tool (late 2021), information on route reviews, series of training videos to support further developing understanding of the regulation requirements, statewide education campaign using community based social marketing to drive behavior change.
- The 2020 Electronic Annual Report has been released and is due on August 2. Jurisdictions can check disposal data in the <u>RDRS reporting system</u> for calendar year 2020. The <u>2020 EAR/RDRS Data Webinar recording</u> (6/22/21) is available to view.
- An update on <u>grant/loan cycles</u> was shared: Tire Incentive Program (due 7/29/21), Farm and Ranch Solid Waste Cleanup and Abatement Grant (due 8/12/21, 11/11/21, 2/10/22), Tire-Derived Aggregate Grant (due 8/18/21, 12/8/21), Beverage Container Redemption Pilot Project Grant Program (open and ongoing through 1/1/22). There is also financial support available for California jurisdictions and businesses. Information is available <u>here.</u>
- The next CalRecycle monthly <u>public meeting</u> is July 20.

10. SB 1383 & AB 1826- ROLLOUT ROUNDTABLE

Eric Wolff, County of San Diego: The County of San Diego Board of Supervisors unanimously approved proposed updates to the Solid Waste Ordinance and Non-Exclusive Franchise Agreement on May 5. The new agreements went into effect July 1.

12. SUBCOMITTEES' REPORT

- **a. Household Hazardous Waste** The group is following legislation regarding treated wood waste.
- **b.** Organics The group provided a presentation on compost and mulch opportunities and best management practices at the SANDAG Regional Planning Committee on June 4. Interest in scheduling a site visit to tour the mid coast transit project that has used 13 miles of compost socks.
- **c.** Edible Food Recovery The group is finalizing the edible food recovery capacity survey. Once complete, the survey will be distributed in the unincorporated area as a pilot. Based on feedback, the survey will be updated and shared with others.
