- 4. Presentation: Copia: Technology Driven Food Recovery Service Creating Efficient Processes and Compliance
  - a. **Kimberly Smith, Copia:** Copia is a food recovery service enabled by technology that connects participating donors with recipients. Donors are businesses that have surplus food items that may include restaurants, hotels, hospitals, universities, events nonprofit organizations, municipalities and more. Participating donors sign up through the Copia app and once registered, are matched with local nonprofit organizations wanting to receive surplus donations. ### 5. CalRecycle Update, Emily Schuetz:

- a. SB 1383 chats will be back in January. These will be recorded and posted on CalRecycle's YouTube channel.
- b. There is new guidance for landfills under SB 1383 the Landfill Guidance: Organic Disposal Reduction Status Impact Report (SIR) Overview. Landfill operators must submit their SIR to CalRecycle by January 1.
- c. There will be an upcoming recorded training and live Q&A session posted on the LEA <u>webpage</u>. This training will provide an overview of measurement requirements, recordkeeping, and reporting requirements for facilities. A notification will be sent out once it's available.
- d. An update on grant/loan opportunities was shared including Farm and Ranch Solid Waste Cleanup and Abatement Grant Program (due 1/9, 4/2), Community Composting for Green Spaces Grant Program (due 1/23), Greenhouse Gas Reduction Loan Program (continuous), Recycling Market Development Zone Loan Program (continuous), Redemption Pilot Project Program (continuous).

#### 7. SB 1383 & AB 1826 Rollout Roundtable

- c. Organics The group discussed the EPA's new waste food scale that replaced the food recovery hierarchy. The Regional Recycling Group, based in Sacramento, develops social media campaigns that can be used by participating jurisdictions. The City of Coronado has used their resources and found great success. San Pasqual Valley Soils is the distributor for Filtrexx Compost Socks. The County is working on a contract to procure compost and mulch products. Biocycle posted a link to the Institute of Self Reliance, partnering with the EPA for community composting activities.
