I. CALL TO ORDER/ PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/ INTRODUCTIONS/ ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chara Cote, EMCC Vice Chair called the meeting to order at 9:30 am. The group recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Introductions were made. There were no announcements.

II. PUBLIC COMMENTS/ PETITIONS

There was a public comment made by Michael Overcast with American Medical Emergency Expedition (AMEX), who presented information on injury proceedings that occurred in Mexico during Baja Racing, which have resulted into lawsuits. III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by James Marugg, seconded by Fred Adler to approve the October 25, 2018 minutes.

IV.STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. Prehospital/Hospital Subcommittee – Chara Cote

Met and discussed several policies at Prehospital/Hospital Subcommittee meeting, which will be discussed later in this meeting during System Policy Review

B. Education/Research Subcommittee – Linda Rosenberg Did not meet.

C. Disaster/Operations Subcommittee – David Blacksberg

Did not meet, but there are two upcoming exercises: 1) an exercise on May 7, 2019 for the hospitals in conjunction with County HHSA. 2) a planned no notice evacuation exercise that will take place before the end of June for the hospitals and County HHSA, which is required by the federal government.

V. COUNTY REPORT (Reports)

A. Clinical Report – Kristi Koenig, MD

- 1.) Surveillance
 - a. We are in flu season.
 - 3,097 total cases, 24 deaths, 2 outbreaks. Across the country 6.2 to 7.3 million people with flu per CDC estimates.
 - Health Officer Flu Order in effect.
 - Jury Duty Excuse Letter last year we will provide.
 - Triggers met for enhanced surveillance on the capacity plan (from Baseline Level 5 to Enhanced Level 4) because of two triggers: respiratory complaints and ED bypass.
 - b. Ebola Outbreak is DRC declared August 1, 2018
 - Challenging due to high insecurity WHO reports suspended vaccination program and contact tracing

- With 600 confirmed cases and 343 deaths recorded since August 2018, the outbreak is the second largest ever after the massive epidemic that struck West Africa 5 years ago and killed over 11,000.
- Second largest outbreak in history, but the risk to spread globally remains low.
- Reviewing CDPH guidance Rady's for children, Cedars-Sinai for adults

2.) Policies and Protocols

- a. Remain on track for ketamine implementation for analgesia on July 1, 2019
- b. Reminder that IV acetaminophen is approved for treatment of pain and NOT for fever.

3.) Initiatives

a. 12-lead EKG transmission to receiving hospitals – CAC reported high percentage of false positive cath lab activations.

There was a long discussion amongst the committee members on EKGs and valid patient identifiers such as not being able to identify who the EKGs belong to.

Action: It was suggested that this topic be moved to the Prehospital/ Hospital Subcommittee for review and input and bring back some recommendations.

- b. Will be applying to the State for Unified Operational Scope of Practice for California within Qualified Transport Programs
 - Six separate procedures are included in this optional scope:
 - 1. Pediatric intubation
 - 2. RSI medication administration including sedative, paralytics, analgesics, and induction agents.
 - 3. Video laryngoscopy
 - 4. Supraglottic airway devices
 - 5. Ventilator initiation, maintenance and management
 - 6. Intraosseous (IO) access for adult and pediatric patients
- National Drug Shortages continue work via NAEMSP Advocacy and Standards and Practice Committees – Top 10 and Top 5 for ASPR in follow up to a meeting
- d. Migrant Caravan Activities
 - Protect the health of the public, including families seeking asylum, by conducting health screening assessments in the setting of the San Diego Rapid Response Network shelter(s), referring for outside medical care as appropriate, monitoring daily reports for infectious diseases. Conducted 2400 health screening assessments for asylum seeking families only, with less than 1% to the emergency departments.
- e. Reminder re: Evidence-Based Medicine presentations from BSPC are posted online at medical director page most recent was on "Hanging, Strangulation and Other Forms of Asphyxiation" by Dr. Steve Campman from the Medical Examiner's office

f. Strangulation Educational Initiative – developing a CAHAN in collaboration with the DAs office, MAC, EMOC, SART and others with a goal for distribution in mid-February.

B. Administrative Report – Chris Lee, EMS Program Coordinator

- 1.) EMS Plan Data Requests this data is necessary and is required before the LEMSA can submit the EMS Plan to EMSA. We thank the agencies that have submitted the requested data and encourage the agencies who have not submitted to do so asap.
- 2.) CARES Data for 2018 the CARES State Coordinator needs the data entered in order to obtain outcome data from the receiving hospitals. We thank the transporting agencies who are up to date on entering the data into the registry and encourage the agencies who are participating in CARES who are not up to date, to enter their data asap.
- 3.) EMT Renewal Effective July 1, 2019, EMTs who are renewing their certification must upload evidence of having received training in naloxone, epinephrine, and blood glucose testing. This training must have been provided by an approved EMT or paramedic training program, or by an approved CE provider. Submitting a Skills Competency Verification Form with the new skills signed off is not sufficient by itself. The EMT must have received formal didactic, skills training, and testing.
- 4.) Upcoming SAVE THE DATE the next Love Your Heart event is on Thursday, February 14, 2019, Valentine's Day. This is an annual event in which organizations from across the U.S. and Mexico join together to provide free blood pressure screenings to the public on Valentine's Day. For agencies that are interested in joining or coordinating an event, can contact us for assistance or can visit livewellsd.org/love-your-heart for registration information.

a. Unified Service Area Report

We are continuing preparations for the RFP to be posted on Buynet. No further updates.

VI. TRANSFER OF CARE (TOC) REPORTING - Josh Smith

- A. We now have two sources of TOC data: LEMSIS data and FirstWatch data.
- **B.** Reminder that TOC is a vital indicator in our surveillance for our capacity plan.
- **C.** If there are errors with the destination field or the ambulance unit field, will most likely not have a TOC button. However, continue sending the reports to Josh Smith because if a pattern emerges, will need to take action.

It was noted that there are login issues on devices with FirstWatch, which is causing lower compliance. Josh will address this issue with FirstWatch.

VII. SYSTEM POLICY REVIEW (EMCC Advisory Position)

A. Discuss and Approve

a. <u>Policy S-414: Do Not Resuscitate</u> – this has been the DNR policy for many years. New End-of-Life Option Act policies have now been merged into S-414 along with the flowchart being updated.

Recommended changes:

- o III, 9, a: strike "and/or area of ventilation when applicable"
- o III, 9, d: add "(airway positioning, suctioning)" after comfort measures
- Last page, Flowchart: realign the last two bottom boxes

Action: Policy S-414 will be brought back to the next EMCC in February with the recommended changes.

b. Policy S-803: Recovery of Prehospital Patient Care Reusable Equipment -

Recommended change:

o III, B, 2: strike entirely

A motion was made by Daryn Drum, seconded by James Marugg to approve Policy S-803 per the recommended change. Motion carried.

- **B.** Policies Coming Before EMCC in 2019
 - <u>S-004: EMS System Quality Improvement</u> This policy is related to the EMS QA/QI plan that has been underway for the last year. Part of the updates are due to LEMSIS and the ability to exchange information more easily between all county EMS agencies and base hospitals. Coming in the near future.
 - S-009: Guidelines for the Prevention of Transmission of Contagious and Contaminants
 This policy is being updated because of the new state law about EMS having to work
 with hospitals and the public health officer to manage patients who are deemed to be
 highly infectious. Currently working with our public health officer to present on this
 topic at this subcommittee.
 - <u>STEMI and Stroke Policies</u> Looking at new regulations and policies, and to fill our QA position. This will include updates to the specialty care designation process.
 - <u>700 (Trauma) Policies</u> The following are being updated: the designation, dedesignation, and other oversight policies and standards. The American College of Surgeons (ACS) changed their procedures slightly and we need to reflect some of those changes.
 - <u>P-804: QA/QI Policy</u> This policy is related to the EMS system quality improvement. To the subcommittee this spring.
 - P-801: Designation of Providers of Advanced Life Support Service This is a broad policy of the ALS provider agency requirements, both first responder and transport. Some of the current topics being reviewed include:
 - o Response time criteria to reflect all county zones
 - Received direction from EMCC in October for looking at the alternative dispatch approval process
 - o Under review, no exact time frame due to many items.
 - Ambulance Ordinance This is the County ordinance for air ambulance, ground ambulance and non-emergency medical transport. Being reviewed with updates, clarification and overall streamlining. Looking to change how the county oversees the non-emergency medical transport sector. Will bring in the air ambulance dispatch fee and developing penalties for EMS agencies that fail to comply with the Ambulance Ordinance. To the subcommittee by end of 2019.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS

A. Membership Update

There are currently eight (8) seats that are due for reauthorization:

- Emergency Nurses' Association, Seats 3 and 4
- San Diego County Paramedic Association, Seats 22 and 23
- Military Agencies, Seat 10
- Supervisor District 2, Seat 25

Members are eligible to two terms. If they want to renew their term, they must submit a nomination letter from their organization along with a completed and signed application to Nicole del Toro.

4. CAPACITY PLAN

 The All-Hazards Health System Capacity Management Plan is currently activated at Level 4 Enhanced Surveillance and has been since December 26, 2018. We are monitoring daily for any indication of unusual system strain that the Health Services Capacity Task Force would need to take action on.

There are five levels of the Capacity Plan:
Level 5 Baseline Surveillance – weekly reporting
Level 4 Enhanced Surveillance – daily reporting and monitoring
Levels 3, 2, 1 – escalating system-wide actions plus daily reporting

5. STAFF REPORT

A. Influenza – As of 12/29/18, 396 new influenza cases, total of 1,730 – considered an elevated level from Public Health Services. Influenza-like illness (ILI) among emergency departments is at 5%.

- B. The current Health Officer Order mandating an annual influenza vaccine (or if declined, must wear a mask while in contact with patients or working in patient care areas) remains in effect.
- C. Jury Duty Letter letter that allows for postponements but does not excuse jury duty. This is the last year that we will submit a jury letter.

V. COUNTY REPORT (Reports)

A. Clinical Report - Kristi Koenig, MD

- 1) Surveillance
 - a. Flu hit a second peak in numbers. 5,486 total cases, 42 deaths, 13 outbreaks. Mostly H1N1 locally.
 - b. Ebola Outbreak in DRC declared August 1, 2018. CDPH CAHAN put out a health alert on February 15. WHO reports 829 confirmed and probable cases and 521 deaths.
 - c. Measles Outbreak more likely to see. CDC has confirmed more than 100 cases in 10 states this year, including Los Angeles County. WHO reporting substantial case increase with outbreaks in more than 40 countries. Highly contagious in susceptible population; airborne transmission.
 - d. Mumps increases in parotitis. Droplet transmission.
- 2) Policies and Protocols

Revising our current pain protocol to assist with our prehospital analgesia strategy implementation when ketamine becomes an additional option on July 1.

- 3) Initiatives
 - a. Received authorization from State for Unified Optional Scope of Practice for California within Qualified Transport Programs on February 20 (through the end of February 2022). Six procedures are included in this optional scope.
 - Pediatric intubation
 - RSI (rapid sequence induction) medication administration
 - Video laryngoscopy

- Supraglottic airway devices
- Ventilator initiation, maintenance and management
- Intraosseous (IO) access for adult and pediatric patients
- b. Migrant Caravan Activities Protect the public's health, including families seeking asylum, by conducting health screening assessments in the setting of the San Diego Rapid Response Network shelter(s), and referring for outside medical care as appropriate. Moving to a new location early March.
- c. Strangulation only 4 lbs of external pressure to occlude the jugular veins; only 5-11 lbs of pressure to occlude the carotid arteries; unconsciousness can occur within seconds, death within 3-5 minutes. Victims with no or minimal external signs of trauma may have life-threatening internal injuries such as carotid, vertebral dissections or fractured hyoid bones. https://www.sandiegocounty.gov/content/dam/sdc/hhsa/programs/phs/cahan/communications documents/02-12-19.pdf

- e. Future pilot project announced on February 14 by CMS for reimbursement for transport to alternate destinations. The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Innovation's (Innovation Center) Emergency Triage, Treat, and Transport (ET3) Model is a voluntary, five-year payment model that will provide greater flexibility to ambulance care teams to address emergency health care needs of Medicare beneficiaries following a 911 call.
- f. Cardiac Arrest Task Force Non-traumatic cardiac arrest best practice model being finalized as an educational product.

B. Administrative Report – Andy Parr

- 1) Health Services Capacity Task Force The new plan is currently in effect. As a review, the plan is designed around five steps, Level 5 being the lowest and 1 being the highest. We are currently at Level 4 due to two metrics exceeding the trigger level: respiratory complaints/provider impressions and ED bypass hours. Also, Transfer of Care time compliance is a critical indicator of system stress, and it is important to push the TOC button at the right time.
- 2) Love your Heart event was on February 14. We thank all who participated.
- 3) EMS Employment Opportunities three full-time positions for 1 year increments, with flexible work schedules, until the tasks are completed. Position can be extended. \$40/hour with no benefits.
 - 1 EMS/Fire Liaison TEP preferably a fire service professional
 - 2 Special Project TEPs seeking experienced EMS professionals to work on
 1) 800 MHz radio updates and upgrades and 2) review current agency MOUs

Preference will be given to local EMS knowledge, programs, and operations. If interested, contact Andy Parr at Andrew.parr@sdcounty.ca.gov or 619-285-6524.

4) Procurements – EMS is currently preparing several Requests for Proposals, including ALS service for the National City Operating Area, the San Marcos Operating Area and the Unified Service Area. In addition, a procurement for patient transport billing in the CSA-17 and CSA-69 areas. During the procurement process, many reviews (internal, departmental, and management) are conducted, therefore timelines can vary substantially. - 5) EMT Renewal the following will go into effect July 1, 2019:
 - For BLS agencies, current optional equipment will be required equipment (AEDs, naloxone, epinephrine autoinjectors, and glucometers)
 - For all EMT renewals, all applicants must upload course completion documents for naloxone, epinephrine, and blood glucose testing. This training may only be provided by an approved EMT or paramedic training program, or an approved CE provider.

We encourage those who are renewing in March, April or May to submit their renewal documentation early to avoid the delay during the expected April spike.

VI. TRANSFER OF CARE (TOC) REPORTING – Josh Smith

EMS has received some reports that the TOC button being pushed early, which affects the TOC reporting in the wrong way.

2019 data is now up. 2018 is still available. Users can search by year, month, emergency room or EMS agency.

VII. SYSTEM POLICY REVIEW (EMCC Advisory Position)

A. Policy S-414: Do Not Resuscitate (DNR) – Susan Smith

While County EMS no longer provides an education powerpoint for the July revisions, we will provide a summary sheet of charges. This summary sheet will include pertinent points related to S-414.

A motion was made by Stephen Abbott seconded by Catherine McJannet to approve Policy S-414 with the recommended change of striking "within 48 hours" on page 3. Motion carried.

B. Policy S-822: Performance Standards for Emergency Medical Service Providers when Responding to Emergency Requests for Medical Services – Andy Parr

This policy only impacts Unified Service Area. Being introduced today; will be presented at the next Prehospital/Hospital Subcommittee meeting and will go to the next EMCC full meeting in March for approval.

Requests/Recommendations:

- A map be provided
- Page 2, II, B, ALS Unit Response Time: add "or staged"
- Page 2, II, B, Emergency Response: add examples of exceptions
- Additional time for County Fire Chiefs to review

Discussion on response times and land use. Stephen Abbott suggested that County EMS speak to Planning and Development Services (PDS) on how this policy may implement or impact land use decisions in North County, or be a part of the County General Plan for fire. Andy Parr and Stephen Abbott will continue their discussion further offline.

Frank Parra, EMCC Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:30 am. The group recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Introductions were made. Frank Parra announced that there has been a request to make a change on the agenda, item IX, B, from a non-voting item to a voting item.

II. PUBLIC COMMENTS/ PETITIONS

There were no public comments or petitions submitted.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Catherine McJannet, seconded by Stephen Abbott to approve the February 28, 2019 minutes, as well as the change on the agenda of item IX, B, from a non-voting item to a voting item. Motion carried.

IV.STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. Prehospital/Hospital Subcommittee – Chara Cote

Met, though Chara Cote was not present to give a report. Everything that was covered at the Prehospital meeting is on the EMCC agenda. No report needed.

B. Education/Research Subcommittee – Linda Rosenberg Did not meet.

C. Disaster Planning Subcommittee – David Blacksberg

Working to get the committee together, and getting the committee and bylaws organized.

V. COUNTY REPORT (Reports)

A. Clinical Report - Kristi Koenig, MD

- 1) Surveillance
 - a. Flu hit a second peak in numbers. As of 3/27/19, 7,886 total cases, 54 deaths, 23 outbreaks. Shifted locally to H3N2 predominantly as of last week with some influenza B as well. Health Officer's flu order has been extended to April 30th due to ongoing activity with the potential to be extended again. Hospitals are encouraged to vaccinate patients prior to discharge to SNFs.
 - b. Ebola outbreak in the DRC was declared August 1, 2018. CDPH site visit to Rady Children's Hospital on March 19th. Andy attended the all-day inspection and states they did very well. The only Ebola preparedness center for adults nearby is Cedars-Sinai Hospital in Los Angeles, though if an adult and child are together Rady can handle both temporarily.
 - c. Measles Outbreak more likely to see. 314 cases have been confirmed by the CDC so far this year in 15 states, including CA and as close as LA County. Highly contagious to susceptible populations due to airborne transmission. Unvaccinated people under age 18 are banned from public spaces in Rockland County, New York following an emergency declaration. The 3I Tool with pictures

- of the measles rash and Koplik spots will be posted on the web page for easy identification of a measles case.
- d. Mumps increase in parotitis cases. As a reminder, mumps is transmitted through droplets.

2) Policies and Protocols

- a. We remain on track for ketamine implementation for analgesia starting July 1st. Reminder to administer *slowly*.
- b. A draft of the new pain protocol was discussed at BSPC last week; the decision made for ketamine concentration of 50 mg/ml to accommodate for both IV and IN dosing.
- c. Ketamine is in shortage.

3) Initiatives

- a. Migrant Caravan Activities Protecting the health of the public including families seeking asylum by conducting health screening assessments in the setting of the San Diego Rapid Response Network shelter(s) and referring for outside medical care as appropriate. Moved to new location in early March. With 270 health screenings and no ED referrals last night, the shelter has exceeded 8,000 screenings to date with only around 1% referred to ED. 911 access has been rarely needed.
- b. EBM presentations are posted on the Medical Director page online.
- Cardiac Arrest Task Force Non-traumatic cardiac arrest best practices is being finalized as an educational product and will be made available on our web page soon.

B. Administrative Report – Andy Parr

- 1) Regular attendees at our routine County meetings may begin to receive calendar announcements from a new EMS Admin email account. This move by EMS allows for greater control over the scheduling of our many EMS meetings.
- 2) Upcoming Procurements The County of San Diego EMS Section continues to be in the preparation stages of the procurement process for several services. These include 9-1-1 Advanced Life Support Ambulance Services for the National City Operating Area, San Marcos Operating Area and the Unified Service Area. In addition, a procurement will also be conducted for Billing and Collection Services for patient's transported from our County Service Area (CSA) 17 and CSA 69 Ambulance Districts. The County's current estimated timelines for posting of procurements are available on the BuyNet site.
- 3) Sidewalk CPR This year the County of San Diego EMS has elected to make a change in the way Sidewalk CPR is provided throughout the County. Rather than selecting one day, each agency or organization may select the day (or days) that they believe would reach their targeted audience of participants. All training totals, if the agencies elect, can be shared with County EMS in order to report on the number of hands-only CPR trained individuals in San Diego County.
- 4) EMS Employment Opportunities three full-time positions for 1-year increments, with flexible work schedules, until the tasks are completed. Position can be extended. \$40/hour with no benefits.
 - 1 EMS/Fire Liaison Temporary Expert Professional (TEP) preferably a fire service professional.
 - 2 Special Project TEPs seeking experienced EMS professionals to work on 1)
 800 MHz radio updates and upgrades and 2) review current agency MOUs.
- 5) EMT Renewal April in odd-numbered years is the peak season of certifications and renewals for MICNs, EMTs, and paramedics. Effective July 1, 2019, EMTs who are renewing their certification must upload evidence of having received training in

naloxone, epinephrine, and blood glucose testing. This training must have been provided by an approved EMT or paramedic training program, or by an approved CE provider. Submitting a Skills Competency Verification Form with the new skills signed off is <u>not</u> sufficient training documentation. The EMT must have received formal didactic and skills training (and testing). EMTs who already have the training and are renewing prior to July 1, 2019 may submit their documentation now to be "checked off" early. Those who do not, should be reminded to physically hold onto their documentation for use during their next renewal.

VI. TRANSFER OF CARE (TOC) REPORTING - Josh Smith

- Policy states that the Transfer of Care application button should be used on the paramedic's device, and only if there is an issue with the device, should the TOC button be used on the Emergency Department's computer.
- 72% of the time the hospital login is being used to record TOC.
- Compliance is back up to the usual 60% after dipping to 52% in January.
- EMS staff recommend that the TOC policy be reevaluated. A subcommittee may need to be developed in order to work on the policy.

VII. SYSTEM POLICY REVIEW (EMCC Advisory Position)

- A. S-413: Triage, Multiple/Mass Casualty Incidents, Annex D (Status update) Will be brought to BSPC next month.
- B. S-166/S-166A: Newborn Deliveries / Out of Hospital Birth Report (Status update) Came before BSPC last week. Approved on consensus. After reading through S-166, it was discovered that some of the ALS treatment elements no longer apply and have been moved to the BLS side. Will make changes that BSPC requested, and will likely be ready for publication July 1st, when the form will be put on our website for agencies to download to place in OB kits and distribute to their paramedics or EMTs.

About 60 out-of-hospital deliveries occur per year throughout the county, and this policy is created to ease the process of those parents obtaining their child's birth certificate through the Office of Vital Records. The County recognizes there are specific timelines for parents to gain official records for their newborn. The form (S-166A) will be handed to the parents by the EMS crew with the basic information required for the Office of Vital Records.

VIII. OLD BUSINESS

S-882: Performance Standards for Emergency Medical Care Providers when Responding to Emergency Requests for Medical Services (Status update) – Andy Parr met with the Fire Chief's Association per their recommendation, and S-882 will not be coming back to the committee in the form originally presented. It was agreed to take the response time matrix out of page 4 and place a draft into the Unified Service Area RFP. It should be noted that with this change, it creates a couple of conflicts with existing policies 1) County Board Policy K-9 and 2) EMS Policy P-801.

IX. NEW BUSINESS

A. Disaster Planning Subcommittee Assignment – (Bylaws Review)

In January, the EMCC asked for a Disaster Planning Subcommittee meeting to discuss the bylaws. A meeting will be scheduled for the subcommittee to meet.

B. The <u>HHSA Fee Package FY 2019/20</u> PowerPoint was presented by Rissa Japlit, Department Budget Manager from the HHSA Budget Office. (Voting Item)

HHSA will present a comprehensive fee package to the Board of Supervisors on April 9, 2019. This is a County-wide effort to comply with B-29 to ensure full-cost recovery where possible. The presentation covered the following: Fee Consideration, Approval Process of the Fee Package, Fees and Rates Proposed for Board Approval, PHS fees, Personnel & Agency Fee proposal, Continuing Education & Hospital Designation Fee Proposal, BHS fees and rates, Proposed Fees and Rates. 

I. CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chara Cote, EMCC Prehospital/Hospital Subcommittee Chair called the meeting to order at 9:30 AM. Introductions were made. Andy Parr announced that he would like to add a conversation about S-882* to the agenda.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES II.

A motion was made by Kevin Mercer, seconded by Mary Murphy to approve the January 10, 2019 EMCC Prehospital/Hospital minutes. Motion carried.

III. PUBLIC COMMENTS/PETITIONS

There were no public comments or petitions submitted.

IV. STAFF REPORT

- Capacity Plan The All-Hazards Health System Capacity Management Plan is currently activated at Level 4 Enhanced Surveillance and has been since December 26, 2018. We are tracking elevated metrics including ED bypass hours, transfer of care. While there have been intermittent periods of system strain, Level 3 Partial Activation has not been implemented.
- Influenza As of week ending in 3/9/1 there have been 564 new cases, which is considered an elevated level. Influenza-like illness (ILI) complaints among emergency departments is at 5%, expected for this time of year. There have been two new influenza-related deaths in the last reporting week, and 5% of deaths registered as pneumonia and/or influenza overall.
- New EMS Admin email account Regular attendees at routine county meetings will begin to receive calendar announcements from a new EMS admin email account to allow for greater control over scheduling the many EMS meetings.
- Upcoming Procurements The County of San Diego EMS is in the preparations stage of procurement for several service areas: In spring of 2019 for the City of National City and the City of San Marcos; in late spring 2019 will be the procurement of the Unified Service Areas, which includes north, central, and south counties in the back country.
- Love Your Heart event We thank the agencies who participated in this event.
- Sidewalk CPR Event Taking suggestions on how to alter the event in comparison to the many other CPR events hosted by different agencies.
- Ketamine Implementation Remaining on track for ketamine implementation to be effective on July 1st. Reminder that IV acetaminophen is approved for pain and not for fever. After BSPC, information will be circulated regarding the ketamine concentration so that medication orders can be placed, although ketamine is currently in shortage.

V. INFORMATIONAL POLICIES

S-166/S-166A: Newborn Deliveries –

Brought to the subcommittee for informational purposes. About 60 out-of-hospital deliveries occur per year throughout the county, and this policy is created to ease the process of those parents obtaining their child's birth certificate through the Office of Vital Records. The County recognizes there are specific timelines for parents to gain official records for their newborn. The form (S-166A) will be handed to the parents by the EMS crew with the basic information required for the Office of Vital Records.

The operational concept is that S-166a can be placed in the OB kit. It will also be produced in the third-party non-affiliated protocol reference book ("The Flip Book") as an acceptable version of the form.

The changes will be going to BSPC for further comments

Changes/Corrections Made

- Line added: "Complete 'Out of Hospital Birth Form' (S-166A) and provide to parent."
- Proposing the addition of S-166A for attachment, the form itself.
- <u>S-413 (New) Proposed Replacement for S-140 (MCI)</u> Brought to the subcommittee for informational purposes. S-413 is replacing S-140, as S-140 seemed more like a policy than a protocol.

The changes will be going to BSPC for further action.

Recommended Changes

- Pg 2, III, D: change "Simple Triage and Rapid Treatment (START)" to "Prehospital providers will utilize a nationally recognized triage system (as an example START Triage)"
- Pg 2, III, D: change "treatment tags may be utilized to document care" to "treatment may be documented"
- Pg 2, III, E: add "If available" after #4, followed by indents for Age, Gender, Primary impression or pertinent findings.
- Information on determination of death was in S-402 and has been deleted from S-413
- Pg 3, III, G: combine the verbiage from G and H to clarify situations for contacting the receiving facility.
- S-882*: Performance Standards for Emergency Medial Service Providers when Responding to Emergency Requests for Medical Services Bringing back for further discussion and comment. Fire Chiefs Association remains the primary objectors to S-882* and wish to take additional time to consider the policy. It was agreed to take the response time matrix out of page 4 and place a draft into the RFP. This policy has a couple of conflicts with the following existing policies 1) County Board Policy K-9 and 2) Policy P-801. Will possibly come back in the coming months for review by EMCC.

VI. PREHOSPITAL TRANSMISSION OF EKGS – REFERRAL FROM CAC

Long group discussion on transmission of EKGs.

- Many EKGs are reporting false positive STEMIs in the field, resulting in hospitals stepping up their cardiovascular STEMI teams.
- No common theme for this issue has been identified, but recommending to extract the
 data to narrow it down. Will prepare to discuss statistics in April about possible
 solutions for the issue.
- Generalized complaint hospitals feel they are not getting the EKGs transmitted to them. Request from field personnel is to tell everyone when the transmission doesn't happen in order to track down the root of when an EKG doesn't transmit. They need actual data of cases to determine what type of problem it is. Suggests compiling a list of the cases and providing them either by patient name, incident number or by some identifier that can be passed on by the providers to track it down.

- 1) Policy S-009: Guidelines for the prevention of transmission of contagions and contaminants will bring back to the subcommittee.
- 2) Policy S-476: Emergency Medical Services at Special Events went to BSPC.

 Will meet on May 9 at 11:00am to start the Bylaws review process.

V. COUNTY REPORT (Reports)

A. Clinical Report – Kristi Koenig, MD

- 1) Surveillance
 - a. As of April 10, over 8,000 cases with 59 deaths, compared to last year with over 20,000 cases and 318 deaths. Flu order will not be extended due to the season winding down.
 - b. The 2018 Ebola outbreak in the Democratic Republic of Congo is being watched. A site visit was done by CDPH at Rady Children's Hospital, which is an assessment hospital for pediatric patients for 72 hours. The closest adult facility is Cedars Sinai in Los Angeles.
 - c. Measles outbreak no cases reported in San Diego, though the state is at Level3 monitoring.
 - d. Ketamine Reminder prior to July 1 implementation: IV Ketamine must be administered slowly and the approved Concentration is 50mg/mL, although aware it is in shortage. Please notify County EMS if your agency is unable to obtain ketamine.
- 2) Policies and Protocols -

We are entering the busy legislation season, and there are multiple bills relevant to EMS in various stages of

amendment. Proposed paramedic regulations are posted on the EMSA website, and comments are due by May 20.

3) Initiatives -

Cardiac Arrest Task Force has released a best practices narrated PowerPoint which is posted on our webpage. This presentation may be adopted by CE providers as a CE opportunity.

B. Administrative Report – Andy Parr

- 1) All Hazard Health Services Capacity Plan currently at Enhanced Surveillance Level 4. There may be some changes after our Operational Core Group call today at noon.
- 2) Sidewalk CPR has been modified. Was previously one day of the year, is now all year long.
- 3) Stroke Awareness Day at the Padres Sunday, May 19th. Stroke Consortium is promoting stroke prevention, awareness and recovery. Can contact County EMS or local hospitals for additional information.
- 4) Excessive Heat Response Plan is a coordinated effort of County departments and partner agencies in order to protect vulnerable populations from the effects of excessive heat by putting the word out such as cool zone locations and closing back county roads and trails. The plan is being updated and activity and messaging will go out in the coming months.
- 5) County EMS employment opportunities three full-time positions for 1-year increments, with flexible work schedules, until the tasks are completed. Positions can be extended. \$40/hour with no benefits.
 - 1 EMS/Fire Liaison Temporary Expert Professional (TEP) preferably a fire service professional.
 - 2 Special Project TEPs seeking experienced EMS professionals to work on 1) 800 MHz radio updates and upgrades and 2) review current agency MOUs.
- 6) Credentialing & Permitting Unit month of April, in odd numbered years, the EMT renewal process peaks, with roughly three times more EMTs requiring renewal. Working collaboratively with our partner agencies, the vast majority of these EMTs came through the process early, and we thank those agencies that helped us get the word out early.
- 7) Stop the Bleed program was an initiative by the Board of Supervisors to have tourniquets placed in County facilities. The kits are attached to AEDs throughout County buildings. County employees are being trained. The Board of Supervisors hopes that other local governments will follow their lead and place Stop the Bleed kits in additional facilities.
- 8) STEMI/Stroke and EMSC regulations have been accepted and will go into effect July 1. As a result, the next Prehospital/Hospital Subcommittee meeting on May 9 will have a long list of policies to review.
- 9) Naloxone data County EMS receives many important requests for Naloxone data. An email with an attached form has been sent out to the agencies requesting this data to allow us to provide accurate, county-wide numbers. An email will be sent out again to ensure everyone received it.

i. Unified Service Area Report

Still in process and on track for late spring.

ii. Update on HHSA Charges and Fees

Went to the Board of Supervisors last Tuesday; was approved on the first reading and will go for the second reading next Tuesday. We anticipate this to be the last of the three-year fees escalation, and will go into effect July 1, 2019.

VI. TRANSFER OF CARE (TOC) REPORTING – Josh Smith

The County is at 60 percent compliance.

VII. SYSTEM POLICY REVIEW (EMCC Advisory Position)

None.

VIII. OLD BUSINESS

A. Transmission of 12 lead electrocardiograms

This topic was brought up at a recent CAC meeting and took it to BSPC meeting. CAC would like to see the transmission sent in advance so they can call to activate the cath lab to reduce the number of false positives. Discussions about this issue and potential policy change are ongoing and routed through the Prehospital/Hospital Subcommittee.

IX. NEW BUSINESS

A. Base Station Physician Committee Meetings – Rescheduling

Potential change in date (same day but one week later) for June and September 2019 BSPC and PAC meetings due to conflicts of other meetings for the physicians. A revised Outlook meeting invite will go out.

B. Bypass Hours Report – Un-Blinding

This was prompted by a request we received from a hospital to provide bypass hours. This information is currently available on Resource Bridge. It is not publicly disseminated information, but it also is not secret.

This information could be released and used as a tool. Looking for input from the committee on comments. This item will come back to the next meeting for further information, discussion and advice.

C. Behavioral Health Survey

Many hospitals are voluntarily reporting Emergency Department bed holds. We have found this data interesting and drives some of our system decisions.


Amelia Kenner-Brininger presented a snap shot of bar graphs with the following data:

I. CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chara Cote, EMCC Prehospital/Hospital Subcommittee Chair called the meeting to order at 9:30 AM. Introductions were made. Mary Murphy announced that Daryn Drum has taken a position in Manhattan Beach and will no longer be on the committee. Mary Murphy will be the primary representative for CPAC, with Dan Froelich as the alternate.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Christopher Scott, seconded by Kevin Mercer to approve the March 14, 2019 EMCC Prehospital/Hospital minutes. Motion carried.

III. PUBLIC COMMENTS/PETITIONS

There were no public comments or petitions submitted.

IV. STAFF REPORT

- 1. Surveillance we are at our second peak in flu numbers, which are finally starting to decrease. Flu order extended to April 30th, with potential to extend again.
- 2. Sidewalk CPR gathering numbers for the entire year for reporting to the American Heart Association, as opposed to one day. Open to ideas for publicizing.
- We remain on track for Ketamine implementation for analgesia effective July 1, 2019. Reminder that IV acetaminophen is approved for treatment of pain and NOT for fever. Variations of this protocol are not encouraged prior to renewal of the application.
- 4. For BLS providers, we are on track for our plan to require AEDs, glucometers, epinephrine autoinjectors, and intranasal naloxone as of July 1, 2019.
- 5. Patient Tracking Module through Research Bridge is in a pilot phase. Currently being implemented at Scripps Mercy, Kaiser, UCSD, and Sharp Memorial hospitals to test patient tracking in a large-scale disaster. May 7th full-scale exercise will be a pilot. November 12th drill will mobilize the new system. Medical Examiners, Sheriff and 211 will also use it for missing persons during large scale events.

V. POLICIES FOR REVIEW

 S-009 Guidelines for the prevention of transmission of contagions and contaminants – No changes except for paragraph C, which is a new paragraph to cover any situation.

Recommended Change:

Include matrix of the Ryan White Act, Mary Murphy will forward.

Long group discussion with suggestions for the form associated with S-009. It was suggested that a space is put on the form to have a number for the agency's duty officer who is authorized to receive test results. Suggestion to have the Public Health Officer to publish a document that can be referenced in the policy regarding the need to determine possible contamination early.

• <u>S-476: Emergency Medical Services at Special Events</u> – Recently implemented. Information from the waiver letters have been added in to the policy.

Recommended Changes:

- o Pg 1, II, A: Add definition of first aid
- Pg 1 and 2, III: Combine verbiage of A and B. Dr. Kahn will give verbiage to committee for notes.
- o Pg 2, III, B, 1, b: strike "criteria"
- o Pg 2, III, B, 1, b, bullet 2: add "(if indicated)" following "The patient's vital

- signs are within normal limits"
- o Pg 2, III, B, 3: Strike first sentence.
- Pg 2, III, B, 3: Add "shall be released to their custodian, if their custodian is not available, they shall" before "be taken to a first aid station or "lost child" holding area."
- Pg 2, III, B, 3: Add a bullet for minors aged 13-17 referencing other policies covering release of a minor. "Children aged 13-17 shall be released in accordance with policy"

This policy will go to BSPC next week for further review.

VI. PREHOSPITAL TRANSMISSION OF EKGS – DISCUSSION

- Some STEMI coordinators have expressed concerns over the number of false positive STEMI pages received. Regular reporting will now integrate causes behind false positive STEMIs
- Presentation by Penny Burke of Sharp Grossmont Hospital
 - o STEMI pages are always more frequent than true STEMI cases
 - Cancelled calls cost the hospital time and money
 - An acceptable cancellation rate is 15%, currently the cancellation rate is over 30%.
 - True STEMI cases vary between medic arrivals and walk-ins over the years.
 - o Percentage of Cancellations by Reason for Cancellation
- Failed transmissions
 - Notify agencies of ST[^] cases that turn out to be false STEMIs to see if there's a programming issue.
 - Get data back to agencies of failed transmissions to get Quality Assurance staff on the case.
 - When the transmission consistency issue is resolved, paramedics can focus on providing clear EKGs and enhance communication between base hospital and paramedics
- Capture information when EKGs aren't transmitted to the base hospital to bring up at protocol review in June along with the importance of getting a good EKG in a controlled environment.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

III. PUBLIC COMMENTS/PETITIONS

A comment was made by Christopher Scott, MD stating that there were eight (8) policies brought to the committee from several different County EMS staff members, given with less than 24-hour notice to review them and provide advice. Recommends that the County send the policies one week in advance of the meeting. Will motion to table all of the policies, except for S-009, until the next meeting.

IV. STAFF REPORT

1. Surveillance -

- Flu is on the decline. Per the May 1st report: 9,287 total cases, 67 deaths, 26 outbreaks, compared to last season with 20,735 cases and 341 deaths. The flu order from the public health officer through April 30th has not been extended. The Health Services Capacity Task Force All-Hazard Management Plan has returned to Baseline (lowest) level.
- Measles No documented cases in San Diego. There have been cases in Los Angeles and Orange County, and most have been associated with international travel. Agencies may want to consider requesting immunization records for the providers to determine staff who may need to receive the MMR vaccine.
- 2. Patient Tracking County of San Diego Emergency Medical Services and the Public Health Preparedness and Response branch are in the process of designing, building, and implementing a Patient Tracking system in conjunction with the San Diego Healthcare Disaster Coalition. The Patient Tracking system is part of LEMSIS Resource Bridge and is currently in its "Pilot" Phase. Four hospitals have tested the system during the Spring 2019 Medical and Health Full-scale Exercise on May 7th which will be followed by further testing in early summer. Thank you to the agencies who participated. Over summer and fall of 2019, Patient Tracking will move to the "Go-Live" phase. Additionally, we are collaborating with organizations such as Office of Emergency Services, Sheriff, Medical Examiner and 211 to include patient tracking as a part of the missing persons reconciliation process in our county.
- 3. Upcoming Procurements Information regarding upcoming procurements can be found on the County of San Diego EMS website. These include 9-1-1 Advanced Life Support Ambulance Services for the National City Operating Area, San Marcos Operating Area and the Unified Service Area. The Unified Service Area procurement will include three distinct areas in one procurement; Inland North, Inland Central, and Inland South.
 - For specific questions regarding these procurements or the process, please contact Kristen McEachron, Senior Contracting Office, Department of Purchasing and Contracting at Kristen.McEachron@sdcounty.ca.gov or (858) 505-6360.
- 4. Sidewalk CPR County EMS would like to thank our community partners for their participation in Sidewalk CPR. This year the County of San Diego EMS has elected

to make a change in the way Sidewalk CPR is provided throughout the County. Rather than selecting one day, each agency or organization may select the day (or days) that they believe would reach their targeted audience of participants. All training totals, if the agencies elect, can be shared with County EMS in order to report on the number of hands-only CPR trained individuals in San Diego County.

- 5. Stroke Awareness Event at the Padres May 19th, against the Pittsburgh Pirates. Discounted tickets are available at

Members of the Stroke Consortium will staff informational booths at the event promoting stroke prevention and recognition. Stroke survivors will also be recognized on the field prior to the game.

- 6. Policies and Protocols -
 - We remain on track for ketamine implementation effective July 1, 2019.
 Reminder that IV acetaminophen is approved for pain, not for fever.
 - Stroke and STEMI policies have been updated to reflect new regulations.
 After committee review goal is that policies will be effective July 1st.
 - For BLS providers, AEDs, glucometers, epinephrine autoinjectors, and intranasal naloxone will be required as of July 1, 2019.
 - Paramedic Regulations are currently open for comment until May 20th. This
 information is available on the EMSA website, <u>www.emsa.ca.gov</u>
- 7. Fees The Board of Supervisors have approved the 2019-2020 fee structure for personnel, agency, and hospital designation fees. The approved fees are the same as the proposed fees presented to EMCC in March. For personnel fees, the County fee has increased from \$63 to \$86. Agency and hospital designation fees will be posted on the EMS website shortly.

V. POLICIES FOR REVIEW

S-003: Program Record Keeper Training and Certification (Chris)
 A motion was made by Christopher Scott, M.D., seconded by Mary Murphy,
 R.N., to table policy S-003 until the next meeting to allow an appropriate amount of time to review the material before making comment. Motion carried.

- S-009 Guidelines for the prevention of transmission of contagions and contaminants (Diane)
 - Many changes that were suggested at the last meeting are specific to the Ryan White Act, which the County does not have purview within the hospital setting to call out specific instructions. Open for discussion to resolve the issue in a different way.
 - Senate Bill 432 passed and significantly amended Health and Safety Code 1797-188, requiring hospitals to have an infection control personnel member available at all times with contact information easily accessible on the hospital's website. Currently only three (3) hospitals are complying with this policy: Palomar, UCSD, and Sharp. If the others can comply with this requirement, a primary source of the issue may be resolved. Diane Ameng has been in contact with hospitals to clarify their progress on complying with new mandate, and while many were unaware of the requirement, they were open to begin work on fixing the issue quickly.
 - o Ideally this will allow for better communication between the hospitals and

- agencies, to comply with the requirement of results as soon as possible, but no later than 48 hours wait time.
- O Hoping to create a form that meets needs between hospitals and agencies. Working towards a fillable form, though that may not be a quick process due to gathering information for what all sides need to be on the form. A paper version of the form will be brought to the committee for review, as it needs major revisions.
- o This policy will return to the next meeting for further review. The goal is to provide clarification and guidance and allow for the policy to serve as a reference and empowerment tool for nurses to ease communication between the agencies and hospitals.

Recommended change: Place a summary of the state law in the policy with a link to the full document if links are capable of being added to policies. Diane will work with Susan on this and bring the policy back for review at the next meeting.

S-019: Cardiovascular Advisory Committee (CAC) (Lorraine)

• P-801: Designation of Providers of Advanced Life Support Service (Andy) – Brought before EMCC. There are a number of sections within that policy. First section is

getting the most attention, which requires two paramedics to be dispatched to an emergency call. Section 9 has had the most revision, which refers to response times. The meeting with the fire chiefs decided the response time matrix from section 9 will appear in RFP, not in P-801. Additional staff will be brought on this summer to assist with that process. Updates will take place in early fall.

• <u>BOS K-9: (Chris)</u> – K-9 has been approved with just a date change and no content changes, but is now being broadened. Can be put on agenda for review at next meeting. Current and proposed versions of K-9 were handed out to the committee, with a request for an electronic copy to be distributed as well.


C. Return of RAP

V. STAFF REPORT

- Measles Outbreak No documented cases in San Diego, but cases in Los Angeles and Orange County. Most have been associated with international travel. Agencies may want to consider requesting immunization records for the providers to determine staff who may need to receive the MMR vaccine.
- 2. Patient Tracking County of San Diego Emergency Medical Services and the Public Health Preparedness and Response Branch are in the process of designing, building, and implementing a Patient Tracking system in conjunction with the San Diego Healthcare Disaster Coalition. The Patient Tracking system is part of LEMSIS Resource Bridge and is currently in its "Pilot" phase. Four hospitals utilized this system during the drill on May 7th. Over summer and fall of 2019, Patient Tracking will move to the "Go-Live" Phase at which time every hospital will be trained on how to use the system to enter and track patients. Additionally, we are collaborating with the organizations such as Office of Emergency Services, Sheriff, Medical Examiner, and 211 to include patient tracking as a part of the missing persons reconciliation process in our county.

3. LEMSIS Elite

- Third-Party Vendor Integration Update: Recent changes to the State schematron resulted in a major system update for Elite. When this system update is completed, work on the Third-Party Vendor Integration will resume.
- CARES Exporting: County EMS is currently in the testing phase between CARES and Image Trend. Once testing is completed (estimated by the end of Summer) agencies using LEMSIS Elite will no longer have to manually enter data into the CARES database, as it will export automatically.
- 4. Upcoming Procurements Information regarding upcoming procurements can be found on the County of San Diego EMS website.
 - National City RFP has been paused at the request of National City.
 - San Marcos is active and working its way through the lengthy approval process.
 - USA (3 procurements) is working its way through the lengthy procurement/approval process.
- 5. Paramedic Regulations The Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA) is proposing modification to Chapter 4 under Division 9, Title 22, of the California Code of Regulations. Chapter 4 contains the standards, policies, and procedures for paramedic training, scope

of practice, licensure, and discipline. The public is invited to submit written comments on modifications to the proposed regulations during the 15-day public comment period from June 11, 2019, through June 26, 2019. Alternate destination is also covered in these modifications, so it is recommended that members of the Prehospital/Hospital subcommittee look over these regulations for potential comment.

- 6. Policies and Protocols
 - We remain on track for ketamine implementation for analgesia, effective July 1st.
 Reminder that ketamine must be administered *slowly* IV and is NOT approved for use for treatment of agitation or for drug-facilitated intubation. It is recommended that dosing be covered in training of ketamine following expressed concern over the large vial size.
 - Reminder that IV acetaminophen is approved for treatment of pain, NOT for fever.
 - Stroke and STEMI policies will be reviewed this month at EMCC updated to reflect new regulations that will be effective July 1st.

The Bylaws were approved by the subcommittee. Additional review discovered another area to be looked, which needs to be run through County Counsel. Therefore, the bylaws are not yet ready for distribution.

V. COUNTY REPORT (Reports)

A. Clinical Report - Kristi Koenig, MD

- 1) Surveillance:
 - a. Influenza
 - i. Influenza is still circulating in the community at about 25 cases a week
 - ii. Latest report from shelter posted July 1; no change from 235 ILI cases
 - iii. Possibly receiving 2 flights/week from Texas so continuing to monitor
 - iv. UCSD has assumed the health screenings as of July 1 and has reported 3 ILI cases recently (county performed 13,630 screenings)
 - v. https://www.countynewscenter.com/county-responds-to-flu-outbreak-at-migrant-shelter/
 - b. Measles
 - i. No cases in San Diego, but more than 1,000 across the U.S.
 - ii. Infected people can spread measles to others from four days before through four days after the rash appears
 - iii. Vaccination is the best way to prevent it
 - iv. August is dark for EMCC, but it is NATIONAL IMMUNIZATION AWARENESS MONTH!

- v. CDC released updated guidelines in July 2019 for infection prevention and control in HC settings
 - Ensure healthcare personnel have presumptive evidence of immunity
 - o HCP include EMS personnel
- vi. https://www.cdc.gov/infectioncontrol/pdf/guidelines/Measles-Interim-IC-Recs-H.pdf
- vii. Consistent with our May 3 Memo: To protect both workers and the public, prehospital providers involved in direct patient care activities should have documentation of measles immunity, confirmed either by receipt of 2 MMR vaccinations or IgG positive serology. We are not prescribing HOW you collect/maintain that documentation nor do we know what public health would accept, however, if personnel are exposed to measles, they may be subject to quarantine until they can demonstrate immunity and could potentially be removed from patient care duties from day 5 to day 21 following exposure.

 - i. WHO declared PHEIC on July 17 following the first case in Goma (a city bordering Rwanda with an international airport)
 - ii. Only the 5th time for such a declaration (2009 H1N1, 2014 Polio, 2014 Ebola, 2016 Zika virus)
 - iii. CAHAN July 17
 - iv. > 2500 confirmed or probable cases with 140 HCWs infected; 40 died (2 community HCWs have been murdered; ongoing unstable security)
 - v. Experimental vaccine highly effective (but in short supply)
 - vi. Regional risk of spread is high, but global risk remains low
 - vii. County PH monitored a portion of the 21-day Ebola monitoring of a HCW returning from treating Ebola patients in West Africa
 - viii. Rady Children Hospital and Cedars Sinai in LA for adults
- d. Mumps
 - i. Circulating in the community; local transmission is occurring
 - ii. CAHAN July 19 Health Advisory Update: Mumps and Acute Parotitis in San Diego
 - iii. Outbreak (7 cases) in local ICE facility

The state of California will be eventually subsidizing UCSD for that support. The volume has dropped, but there are still issues. The county is fully involved for anything related to communicable diseases.

To be discussed by the Prehospital/Hospital Subcommittee meeting following this meeting. To continue as an Old Business agenda item; not yet completed.



- b. CARES Exporting: County EMS is currently in the testing phase between CARES and Image Trend. Once testing is completed—estimated by the end of summer—agencies using LEMSIS Elite will no longer have to manually enter data into the CARES database, as it will export automatically.

Strangulation Prevention Campaign: San Diego Health CARES Initiative A PowerPoint presentation was provided by Dr. Koenig and Tracy Prior, Chief Deputy District Attorney.

ACTION: It was suggested to emphasize this topic to our Prehospital Agencies

1) Surveillance

- a. Influenza Flu season is coming!
 - Early signs point to a possible severe flu season; Australia had a particularly severe season; flu is unpredictable and we are continuing to see cases year round
 - ii. 22 cases, 2 deaths and 1 outbreak already reported for 2018-2019 timeframe in San Diego.
 - iii. FluWatch usually comes out in mid-October, but is planned to start on October 2 this season.
 - iv. There will NOT be a "Jury Duty Excuse" letter this year (as we noted last year) and it is not needed for a medical professional to defer jury duty.
 - v. Health Officer Order for Influenza Vaccination Program or Masking of Healthcare Personnel during Annual Influenza Season remains in effect. http://www.sdiz.org/documents/HCP/SDIB-Bulletins/Health-Officer-Order-Mandatory-Vaccination-or-Masking-FINAL.PDF
 - vi. For the purposes of this Order, emergency medical service personnel include paramedics, emergency medical technicians (EMTs), and advanced EMTs.
 - vii. This order is ongoing indefinitely and applies to current and future influenza season unless the order is rescinded. For purposes of this order, the influenza season is defined as November 1 to March 31 of the following year. In any given year, if influenza surveillance data demonstrate unusually early and/or late peaks, the Health Officer may extend the period during which the masking program shall apply for that year. This means as of November 1 (at the latest) all care providers must be vaccinated or wear a mask.
 - viii. On September 10th, the governor signed two bills (SB 276 and SB 714) tightening medical exemptions for immunizations.

b. Mumps

- i. Increasing cases in San Diego & Baja California; can anticipate more
- c. Measles
 - i. The measles virus was declared eliminated in the U.S. in 2000.
 - ii. From January 1 to September 19, 2019, 1,241 individual cases of measles have been confirmed in 31 states. That's the largest number of cases since 1992.
 - iii. U.S. is in danger of losing elimination status (by WHO). If more cases of the measles virus are detected, October 1 could mean an end of elimination status. Look for news reports on this!
 - iv. August 7 first case of measles this year in San Diego County was confirmed in an 11-month-old resident who had recently traveled to the Philippines.
 - v. A fully immunized adult exposed to this case was confirmed to have measles on August 20. Fortunately, we are out of the window for additional exposures from this event
 - vi. Providers involved in direct patient care activities should have documentation of measles immunity, confirmed either by receipt of 2 MMR vaccinations or IgG positive serology (recent report of death of

- Israeli flight attendant who had 1 MMR highlights the need for a full series).
- vii. Remember that asymptomatic persons infected with measles can transmit the disease.
- viii. Disease transmission can occur without any direct patient exposure simply by entering a room where an infected patient has been.
- ix. Measles PPE requires N-95 or equivalent due to it being AIRBORNE transmission.

 National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) Office of EMS
 collaborated with the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ)
 to support a review of the evidence and effectiveness of a number of
 analgesic options. The reviewers, a team from the University of Connecticut
 Evidence-based Practice Center, analyzed more than 60 published studies
 and looked at treatments including opioids, ketamine, non-steroidal antiinflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) and acetaminophen.

As initial therapy in the prehospital setting:

- Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs provide similar pain relief to opioids and may cause fewer overall side effects and less drowsiness.
- Acetaminophen may provide similar pain relief to opioids, and may cause fewer side effects overall and less dizziness.
- Ketamine may provide similar pain relief to opioids. Ketamine may cause more dizziness or overall side effects, while opioids may cause more respiratory depression.
- Combining an opioid with ketamine may be more effective in reducing pain compared with opioids alone.
- If morphine does not adequately relieve pain, changing to ketamine may be more effective and more quickly reduce pain than giving additional morphine.

NHTSA recently released a Notice of Funding Opportunity requesting applications from organizations interested in leading the development of an evidence-based guideline (EBG) for the pharmacologic management of acute pain by EMS in the prehospital setting.

C. MCSD Report – Jennifer Tuteur, MD

1) Federal Government visit: Chief Medical Advisor to the President and the Chief Medical Officer to the Department of Homeland Security came back for a follow-up visit with our best practices of public private partnerships, including a less than 1% transport to emergency departments toward the shelter for asylum seeking families. The asylum shelter has been turned over to UCSD. No longer seeing 200 people a day come through the shelter, but less than 20 people a day. Our presentations were well received. Grateful for everyone's participation and support with the partnership in order to protect the public health.

VIII. OLD BUSINESS



- 1) Surveillance
 - a. Influenza
 - i. FluWatch updated weekly (started 2 weeks early this season) https://www.sandiegocounty.gov/hhsa/programs/phs/documents/InfluenzaWatch.pdf
 - ii. As of November 20, 614 cases, 3 deaths, 4 outbreaks
 - iii. Health Officer Order for Influenza Vaccination Program or Masking of Healthcare Personnel during Annual Influenza Season remains in effect. http://www.sdiz.org/documents/HCP/SDIB-Bulletins/Health-Officer-Order-Mandatory-Vaccination-or-Masking-FINAL.PDF

- iv. This order is ongoing indefinitely and applies to the each and future influenza season unless the order is rescinded. For purposes of this order, the influenza season is defined as November 1 to March 31 of the following year. In any given year, if influenza surveillance data demonstrate unusually early and/or late peaks, the Health Officer may extend the period during which the masking program shall apply for that year. This means as of November 1 (at the latest) you must be vaccinated or wear a mask.
- b. Other surveillance Ebola, VAPI, measles (Disneyland exposure October 16), mumps (cases increasing also in Baja California), heat, fire alerts/power outages (PSPS), wound botulism from Black Tar heroin
- 2) Policies and Protocols
 - a. Protocol review underway for implementation July 1, 2020
 - Public comment period closed November 1, 2019; Protocol Task Force met November 15th. Comments being reviewed
 - ii. Hospital diversion policy under review
 - b. CDC issued updated guidance for TB screening among healthcare workers in May, 2019

(https://www.cdc.gov/mmwr/volumes/68/wr/mm6819a3.htm?s_cid=mm6819a3_w). The largest change in these recommendations include a move away from annual TB testing for most health care workers.

- i. Updated 2019 CDC recommendations on Tuberculosis Screening, Testing, and Treatment of U.S. Health Care Personnel have not been adopted in the State of California and the current regulations are still applicable. Here is a link to a statement from the California TB Controllers Association regarding this topic: https://ctca.org/wp-content/uploads/CTCAresponseMay2019.pdf
- ii. Regulations regarding annual TB testing among healthcare workers in California include 1) Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations, owned by the Licensing and Certification (L&C) Branch of the California Department of Public Health; and 2) Title 8 of the Aerosol Transmissible Diseases (ATD) Standard owned by CalOSHA.
- iii. In August 2019, L&C issued an All Facilities Letter (https://www.cdph.ca.gov/Programs/CHCQ/LCP/Pages/AFL-19-28.aspx) allowing health care facilities to submit a TB Program Flexibility request to their local L&C district office to follow new CDC guidelines (they anticipate updating Title 22 in the future). - iv. CalOSHA ATD Standards currently requires offering TB testing and performing a TB assessment annually for applicable healthcare workers (https://www.dir.ca.gov/title8/5199.html). CalOSHA is currently working on an update to this policy, but the content and the date of the update are not yet known.
