# IV. PROJECT UPDATES – (Anne Jensen)

#### City of San Diego Pilot

- Continue training people out in the field and prepping them for the consent process.
- The regs are now in place; in a 1-year grace period at the State level.
- Certain program functions have not had a lot of guidance for the pilot sites in this interim period.
   Therefore, the program is not aggressively enrolling new clients.
- Had a high number of vulnerabilities among high utilizers in the system and may not have capacity to consent to some elements.
- Will start seeing additional people enrolled in the program soon.
- The independent evaluator for the pilot program wants to review program metrics. Will meet next Friday
  to see if the data and metrics can be better captured. Learning locally that some local metrics don't mesh
  with state-level measures. As a group, the focus should be on how to measure outcomes and capturing
  the values.

#### VI. OLD BUSINESS

A. Cyber Incident System Research Project (Chris Scott, MD)

The impact of the IT disaster suffered by the hospital system in San Diego in May 2021, affected four emergency departments and five hospitals.

- Identified the disaster period was 7 days (May 1 May 7) and compared that with the 7 days prior and the 7 days after the incident.
- Dispatch times saw a 16-17% increase in the assignment time for ambulances during the evaluated period.
- TOC was delayed from 16.4 minutes to 20.9 minutes on average, which was a 27% increase.

# ACTION: An offline follow-up between staff and Dr. Chris Scott to occur, with a goal of identifying the best place to move the research to develop evidence-based solutions.
