I. CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

Dr. Weinstein called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made and seconded to approve the November 19, 2019 minutes. Motion carried.

III. COUNTY REPORT (Kristi Koenig, MD)

- A. Surveillance
 - 1. Influenza
 - a. FluWatch updated weekly (started 2 weeks early this season) https://www.sandiegocounty.gov/hhsa/programs/phs/documents/InfluenzaWatch.pdf
 - b. As of January 15, 7557 cases (compared to 2643 last season), 20 deaths (compared to 16 last season), 16 outbreaks cases may be UNDERESTIMATED due to less testing
 - c. Shifting from Flu B to Flu A; ED ILI 8% of all visits
 - d. System stress, sick calls (up to 10%)
 - e. Health Officer Order for Influenza Vaccination Program or Masking of Healthcare Personnel during Annual Influenza Season remains in effect http://www.sdiz.org/documents/HCP/SDIB-Bulletins/Health-Officer-Order-Mandatory-Vaccination-or-Masking-FINAL.PDF
 - f. This order is ongoing indefinitely and applies to the each and future influenza season unless the order is rescinded. For purposes of this order, the influenza season is defined as November 1 to March 31 of the following year. In any given year, if influenza surveillance data demonstrate unusually early and/or late peaks, the Health Officer may extend the period during which the masking program shall apply for that year. This means as of November 1 each season (at the latest) you must be vaccinated or wear a mask.
 - 2. n2019 Novel Coronavirus (2019 nCoV) Reminder to take a travel history!

 - b. Travel history from Wuhan City, China may be the only epidemiological link available to EMS
 - c. Fever and lower respiratory infection symptoms
 - d. Symptomatic screening at LAX (SFO and JFK) may not identify an exposed or infected traveler within the incubation period, currently reported as 14 days (as for the other human CoV of SARS and MERS)
 - e. Standard precautions and droplet and aerosol precautions would apply (hand washing, gloves and eye protection along with an N-95 respirator)
 - f. Patient-to-healthcare provider transmission has not yet been reported however this is a dynamic situation
 - 3. Other surveillance Ebola, VAPI, measles, mumps (cases increasing also in Baja California), heat, fire alerts/power outages (PSPS), wound botulism from Black Tar heroin

 - 1. As per your request, rescheduling the EBM talks for this month and next to allow more time for protocol discussion; plan a working lunch
 - 2. Protocol review underway for implementation July 1, 2020
 - a. Public comment period closed November 1, 2019; Protocol Task Force met November 15th. Today we'll be covering the adult protocols looking forward to your input
 - b. Pediatric protocols next month
 - c. Hospital diversion policy under review
 - 3. Drug Shortages
 - a. Continuing to closely monitor please order your meds EARLY
 - b. North County experiencing shortages of D50, Calcium Chloride, and Cardiac Epi

 - a. Approved at EMS Commission in December for approval; Once commission approves, then submitted to Office of Administrative Law; OAL has 30 days to review and approve/deny
- 2. Community Paramedicine
 - a. OSPHD has approved another extension of the existing pilot projects through November 2020
- 3. DV Strangulation

- a. As a follow on to the Oct 16th All day training for healthcare staff (train-the-trainers), 6-week webinar series in 2020; Second one in the series is this Thursday, where I'll be speaking on signs and symptoms (flyers on table)
- 4. 2019-2020 All-Hazard Health Services Capacity Management Plan
 - a. Capacity Plan moved from Enhanced Surveillance to Partial Activation
 - b. Regular meetings from Operational Group members to including input from prehospital sector; monitoring 7 days per week
