#### I. CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

#### II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

## III. COUNTY REPORT (Kristi Koenig, MD)

- A. Surveillance
  - 1. Influenza
    - a) FluWatch updated weekly (started 2 weeks early this season) <a href="https://www.sandiegocounty.gov/hhsa/programs/phs/documents/InfluenzaWatch.pdf">https://www.sandiegocounty.gov/hhsa/programs/phs/documents/InfluenzaWatch.pdf</a>
    - b) As of November 13: 475 cases, 3 deaths, 2 outbreaks
    - c) Health Officer Order for Influenza Vaccination Program or Masking of Healthcare Personnel during Annual Influenza Season remains in effect.

      - i. This order is ongoing indefinitely and applies to the each and future influenza season unless the order is rescinded. For purposes of this order, the influenza season is defined as November 1 to March 31 of the following year. In any given year, if influenza surveillance data demonstrate unusually early and/or late peaks, the Health Officer may extend the period during which the masking program shall apply for that year. This means as of November 1 (at the latest) you must be vaccinated or wear a mask.
  - 2. Other surveillance Ebola, VAPI, measles (Disneyland exposure October 16), mumps (cases increasing also in Baja California), heat, fire alerts/power outages (PSPS), wound botulism from Black Tar heroin

#### B. Policies and Protocols

- 1. Protocol review underway for implementation July 1, 2020
  - a) Public comment period closed November 1, 2019; Protocol Task Force met November 15<sup>th</sup> and comments are being reviewed
  - b) Hospital diversion policy under review
- 2. CDC issued updated guidance for TB screening among healthcare workers in May 2019 (<a href="https://www.cdc.gov/mmwr/volumes/68/wr/mm6819a3.htm?s\_cid=mm6819a3\_w">https://www.cdc.gov/mmwr/volumes/68/wr/mm6819a3.htm?s\_cid=mm6819a3\_w</a>). The largest change in these recommendations include a move away from annual TB testing for most health care workers.
  - a) Updated 2019 CDC recommendations on Tuberculosis Screening, Testing, and Treatment of U.S. Health Care Personnel have not been adopted in the State of California and the current regulations are still applicable.   - b) Regulations regarding annual TB testing among healthcare workers in California include 1) Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations, owned by the Licensing and Certification (L&C) Branch of the California Department of Public Health; and 2) Title 8 of the Aerosol Transmissible Diseases (ATD) Standard owned by CalOSHA.
  - c) In August 2019, L&C issued an All Facilities Letter (<a href="https://www.cdph.ca.gov/Programs/CHCQ/LCP/Pages/AFL-19-28.aspx">https://www.cdph.ca.gov/Programs/CHCQ/LCP/Pages/AFL-19-28.aspx</a>) allowing health care facilities to submit a TB Program Flexibility request to their local L&C district office to follow the new CDC guidelines (they anticipate updating Title 22 in the future).   - d) CalOSHA ATD Standards currently requires offering TB testing and performing a TB assessment annually for applicable healthcare workers (<a href="https://www.dir.ca.gov/title8/5199.html">https://www.dir.ca.gov/title8/5199.html</a>). CalOSHA is currently working on an update to this policy, but the content and the date of the update are not yet known. #### C. Initiatives

- 1. Paramedic Regulations
  - a) Will go to EMS Commission in December for approval; Once commission approves, then submitted to Office of Administrative Law; OAL has 30 days to review and approve/deny
  - b) Alternate destination language has been REMOVED
  - c) 4 hours of tactical EMS training requirements have been added to the latest draft
  - d) Expecting legislative proposals for alternate destination authority for paramedics in Jan 2020
- 2. Community Paramedicine
  - a) OSPHD has approved another extension of the existing pilot projects through Nov. 2020
- 3. New State Stroke and STEMI TAC established Lorraine Calzone, RN from County EMS has been appointed!
- 4. Strangulation Initiative
  - a) Collaboration between County PHO and DA; Press Conference held on Oct 15<sup>th</sup> and All-day training for healthcare staff (train-the-trainers) held on October 16<sup>th</sup>
  - b) Webinars being scheduled for 2020
- 5. 2019-2020 All-Hazard Health Services Capacity Management Plan
  - a) Distributed on October 3rd
  - b) Contains new working definition of ED BH Holds
