IV. COMMITTEE ORGANIZATION

V. MANAGEMENT TEAM REPORT

A. Budget and Financial Report

The CSA-17 2nd Quarter FY 2020-2021 Financial Overview was presented by Tom Wieczorek and Matt Zavadsky from the Center of Public Safety Management (CPSM), which covered the following: Revenues, Expenses, Operations Analysis, Reserve Analysis, Revenue Projection, Expense Projection, Net Projection, and Volume Analysis.

i. Accept the Financial Report

Discussion on reduction in call volume, dramatic cost increase and supply of PPE, change of Collection agency by County, and excess Reserves.

ACTION: A motion was made by Peter Zovanyi, seconded by Nancy Hillgren to approve the Financial Report. Motion carried.

B. EMS County Report

- i. EMS Agency Report Andy Parr, MCSD Deputy Director
 - EMS office in Grantville is closed. Currently, all employees are teleworking. New office space is a hub with business machines, and it is up and running.
 - Have a new mailing address, a PO BOX. Sharing with agencies.
 - Reminder for EMTs and Paramedics renewing their certification of licensure in the next
 three months to get it submitted early. In late winter or early spring of odd-number years,
 EMS receives a very high number of certifications for renewal. End of March is the
 busiest time. EMS can accept renewals up to six months in advance without adjusting
 time and continuing education requirements.
 - Emergency Medical Care Committee (EMCC) is the Board's committee for EMS revision and oversight across entire county. New Chair and Vice Chair will be chosen at the 2/26 meeting. If interested in attending, you can get log in information on www. SanDiegoCountyEMS.com. One of EMCC's three subcommittees, the Education-Research subcommittee, will resume meeting on 2/12, which will give the County advice on implementation of AB1544 which speaks to development of community paramedicine programs and potential alternate destinations other than Emergency Departments.
 - The All-Hazard Health Services Capacity Management Plan is a public-private partnership between the Healthcare community and County's EMS agency. Plan is currently at a Level 1 Full Activation and has been for over a year. The Task Force allows for many stakeholders to have a voice in the health services community to give

- input and advice for policies and procedures to make a dent in the emergency that is affecting our community.
- CSA-17 Ground Ambulance re-procurement information is available. Being done by
 County Department of Purchasing and Contracting not EMS. Information on process can
 be found at http://buynet.sdcounty.ca.gov. You can log in as guest. Search the key word
 Ambulance; information can be downloaded. There are three opportunities for the public
 to give input and advise on what the elements of CSA-17 contract for the future should
 look like: Wednesday, 2/10, 2pm; Wednesday 2/17 at 6pm; and Saturday 2/20 at 10am.
- Out of District Transport Fee Report to go to the Board of Supervisors on April 6.
- County has engaged another consultant paid for by EMS. Kevin Crawford Consulting will look at four separate items, one of which is monitoring CSA-17 re-procurement.

ii. Consultant Report Update

The Consultant's report is expected to roll out at the next meeting in May. EMS Administrator Andy Parr will meet with Supervisors of Districts 3 and 5 to give them an early peak of the report in about a month.

C. Ground Ambulance Provider Report – Dave Austin, CSA Program Manager

- CSA-17 Quarterly Performance Reports for October, November and December 2020 were included in Board packets. The Quarterly Performance Reports were presented which covered: Response Time Compliance, Mutual Aid, Transports by Community. Pleased to report another solid quarter of compliance overall in the CSA.
- 2. <u>Community and Public Service</u> continue to have monthly calls to discuss opportunities in the COVID environment. Were able to have a virtual open house at Del Mar fairgrounds for the coastal agencies, Rancho Santa Fe, and training center in October. Jointly produced a PSA for holiday safety in the CSA and have had over 300 reviews.
- 3. <u>CARES network</u> (Cardiac Arrest Registry to Enhance Survival)—year to date numbers are 4.7% survival rate, 48.8% by standard CPR and zero AED applications. Overall numbers for cardiac arrests are down. Not all hospitals have reported the final data. Official numbers for this CSA will be published in March.
- 4. <u>Continuing Education Sal Ruiz.</u> 79 hours of training were delivered in October, November and December. Trainings included: Vaccination, Physiology, PALS renewal, Stress, Public safety diver, Diabetes treatment, Glucose checking, and NARCAN administration.
- 5. Discussion on the administration of COVID-19 vaccines by CSA-17 personnel to community members and the Del Mar Fairgrounds serving as a vaccination center.

D. Operations Chief's Meeting Report - Robbie Ford

- Between 70-80% of staff at Solana Beach, Del Mar and Encinitas Fire Departments, and Lifeguard agencies, are in their second round of vaccinations. Some received vaccinations while on duty. Seen a slight uptick of those that originally declined getting vaccinated, receiving the vaccination with their co-workers.
- Some personnel are having 24–48-hour post vaccination symptoms including headaches, chills, fever etc. which is to be expected. No significant impact on the workforce.
- Three coastal agencies and Rancho Santa Fe continue to support 'Operation Collaboration', a
 partnership with CALfire, originally to vaccinate First responders. Launched mobile pods to
 vaccinate long-term care facilities, smaller board and care facilities, and other targets of
 opportunity. Strong coordination with Health and Human Services across the county, which is
 effective. Doing vaccinations for first responders plus those who are 65 and older and affiliated
 with city government. Appointments are scheduled via QR code
- During the holidays, had a lot of illness and assessments from infection control team for employees. Of all the people tested, did not have many positives relative to the amount of people who were assessed. There are other viruses going around mimicking COVID symptoms. Kudos to Sal and his efforts in managing that as Infection Control Officer.

- Started a Joint Fire Academy with new hires from Encinitas, Solana Beach and Rancho Santa Fe, being run by the three agencies. Four-week academy ending in the last week of February. Still have vacancies in Solana Beach. Doing new hire test from the three cities in March.
- Had three retirements in December:

- A. Out of District Transport Fee Report Andy Parr, EMS Administrator
 - May go as part of fee package on April 6, date not confirmed.
 - Next Board of Supervisors meeting is on February 9, and CSA-17 is on the agenda. The consent item is to give County staff permission to complete the re-procurement process. Required when the amount of award is thought to be greater than a million dollars.
- B. LAFCO update

EMS Administrator Andy Parr provided a PowerPoint presentation – <u>LAFCO Report, CSA 17, San Dieguito EMS District</u>, which covered the following: Background, Local Area For Action Commission (LAFCO) and Sphere of Influence, CSA-17 Boundaries with Sphere of Influence, Annexation of Harmony Grove, Unified Service Area, Current Status.

- C. Lifeguard Report Mike Stein, Encinitas Fire Department
 - The group agreed to add a Lifeguard report once a year, however, did not set time for it.
 - Lifeguards were initially included in all coastal agencies communications to vaccinate. It's all been completed and includes full-time and temporary/ seasonal staff currently on the roster.
