A. Prehospital/Hospital Subcommittee - Chara Cote, RN

The group met. Discussed policies S-400 and S-416; The subcommittee suggested a second phase of public comment. These policies are open for public comment for 30 days (4/14 – 5/13).

B. Education and Research Subcommittee - Cheryl Graydon, RN

V. COUNTY REPORTS

A. Clinical Report - Kristi Koenig, MD, EMS Medical Director

i. COVID-19 Update

There was no report given.

B. Administrative Report - Tyler Meick, EMS Coordinator

- Health Services Capacity Plan Level moved to Level 4 Enhanced Surveillance; CDC COVID-19 Community Level is Low; Southern California Fire Preparedness Level is at Level 1.
- The Comprehensive Base Station Hospital and Trauma Catchment Area Consultant's work is underway! There will be ample opportunity to receive public comment as they gather input and begin to formulate 6 different models for us to compare as models for the future of EMS in San Diego County. The Consultant will also look at the Trauma Center Catchment Area Map to assure that Trauma Centers receive an optimal balance of Trauma calls at each center.
- Policies and Protocols: The 2023-2024 protocol review is completed. A summary of all updates is posted on the County EMS webpage. The timeline for final implementation is on track for July 1, 2023.

Some notable additions to this year's protocol package include:

- o TXA for significant traumatic and post-partum hemorrhage
- o Buprenorphine pilot program
- o Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation Cardiac Arrest pilot
- o The FAST-ED stroke severity score

We would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for taking the time to provide valuable recommendations for change, and to critically evaluate the draft protocols to make our system as up-to-date and evidence informed as possible.

EMS Fleetmap changes coming soon:

Kaiser Permanente will be opening a new hospital in the San Marcos area with emergency department services. This hospital is slated to open in August 2023. In anticipation of this facility opening, RCS has created two new 800 Mhz radio talk groups.

- o KSMAR will be added to the "BLS" zone.
- SD MEDAIR2 will be added to the "BLS" zone to be used as the secondary air to ground channel between the scene and air ambulance providers.

RCS/Sheriff Wireless is currently planning this integration with updated fleet map(s) and a plan to create new "code plugs" which are needed to reprogram all necessary Fire, EMS, and public/private agency radios.

Phase 1, RCS will need to "touch" every radio in every ambulance. A plan is already underway to update ambulances in the North County first, then ambulances in the central region, and so forth.

Phase 2 will include fire apparatus, law enforcement and any other remaining vehicles.

Agencies will be notified when it's their turn to update radios. Agencies may be asked to bring vehicles (&radios) to a centralized location to facilitate the rapid update of your agency's radios. Once notified of the coming updates and schedule, we ask that all agencies and companies to coordinate with RCS/Sheriff Wireless to ensure these updates occur in a timely manner.

Upcoming state Paramedic Scope of Practice changes:

The State of California EMS Authority has notified stakeholders that a regulatory update to include additional medications for the paramedic scope of practice posted for a 45-day public comment period on April 21. These additions would move TXA, ketorolac, ketamine, and IV acetaminophen from Local Optional Scope of Practice to basic scope, lowering the regulatory burden for those LEMSAs adopting these treatment modalities. County EMS supports these adjustments, and are proud that our local successes with ketamine and acetaminophen have provided support to this enhancement in state paramedic practice.

- Public Comment Process is LIVE and improving everyday:
 - Public Comment Posting Notification email "subscription" is active. Please submit your email if you would like to receive notification of upcoming public comment periods
 - o "Coming Soon" policy notifications are regularly updated
 - Comments will be shared with the Prehospital/ Hospital Subcommittee as well as posted to the Recently Concluded Public Comment Drafts section of the webpage
 - Current Policies are available for comment include:

Scope of Practice for Paramedics, T-460A Trauma Patient Criteria, and the new ECPR Care Center Designation requirements

EMSA Policy Update:

As a reminder, the ability for EMS personnel to exercise the expanded services allowed by the Governor's Executive Order ended February 28. EMS personnel are no longer be able to:

- Perform their current SOP in hospitals, Alternate Care Sites, Shelters, or any other static site
- Conduct Covid and Influenza testing
- Provide vaccinations (COVID, Flu, and/or MPX)
- And paramedics will no longer be authorized to Administer or monitor mAb (Monoclonal Antibody Treatments)
- Several County Meetings are returning to in-person: County EMS holds several community meetings each month. 6 are "Brown Act" meetings and require specific public notification, access, and recordation. The prior allowances under AB-361 and the Governor's Emergency Order ended February 28, 2023. Committee members should plan on attending the EMCC, CSA-17 Advisory Board, and these bodies' subcommittee meetings in person.
- Current Medication Shortages: County EMS is aware of multiple medication shortages including albuterol, dextrose and activated charcoal. Additional information and guidance on these medication shortages can be found on the homepage of our website. Also, we would like to remind everyone that our previous guidance on the use of metered dose inhalers is still active and paramedics may use albuterol metered dose inhalers in lieu of nebulized albuterol.
- EMT Renewals submit early!
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 - In the spring of odd-numbered years (2023, 2025, etc.), the County EMS Credentialing Team is inundated with EMT renewal applications. Agencies are asked to work with their EMT staff to make sure their applications are submitted early to avoid the rush. As a reminder, EMT Skills Verifications are no longer waived.
- County EMS Office Holiday Closure Advisory: May 29, 2023 Memorial Day (County Holiday)
- New Faces soon at EMS: County EMS has hired a number of new employees. In addition, we have a few more positions in the pipeline. Our goal is improving the presence in the EMS Community specifically well our customer service, outreach, and participation with the Hospital and EMS agencies as needed.
- Fee Schedule Escalation Year 3: Two years ago, EMCC gave their approval for a 3-year escalation of EMS personnel fees. Beginning July 1, 2023, EMS personnel fee will escalate \$20 additional dollars to \$146 every other year in accordance with Board Policy B-29 which requires cost recovery for County required services.
- <u>EMS Medical Director Regulatory Oversight:</u> Many of you that have used the County EMS Medical Director as your own will soon be receiving an official termination letter. The final termination date for these services is 7/1/2023. EMS Agency Administrators are requested to update their LEMSIS Agency profile with their EMS Medical Director listed. Even better would be for your EMS Medical Director to have their own LEMSIS Account so they can receive all the official communications send by the EMS Office in real time.

i. EMS Technology Presentation

Michael Assof, EMS Coordinator, presented the EMS Mobile App, which is accessible at https://emsmobile.sandiegocounty.gov/. The EMS Mobile App is a browser-based application and works on any internet connected device with a web browser. The app consists of the following features: Adult Protocols, Pediatric Protocols, Policies, References, Bookmarks, Keyword Searching.
