PROTOCOL REVISION



EVERY OTHER YEAR IS A PLANNED LARGE REVISION

- Annual review
 - Effective date July 1
 - > Avoid "off-cycle" updates whenever possible
- BSPC is the designated protocol/medical control advisory group
- Process design:
 - Input collected in the fall
 - Internal review November January
 - BSPC review January March
 - Final versions April May
 - Provider training May June

Small revision year QA/QI updates Clarification/refinement Input from stakeholders

Large revision year

- Science updates
- New medications
- Input from stakeholders
- Biannual national standard updates
- Data from prior two-year cycle



2021 GOALS

- Engage the EMS community in the process
- Consistency in treatment, terms, and abbreviations
- Eliminate redundancy
- Align with AHA and other evidence-based standards
- Clear, concise formatting, particularly for cardiac arrest and arrythmia management protocols
- Consistency across Adult and Pediatric protocols
- Generic names for all medications



RESULTS

- Complete restructure of the cardiac arrest/arrythmia protocol to improve usability
- Increased alignment with national standards including ACLS,
 PALS, and NASEMSO as well as neighboring LEMSAs
- Streamlined OB/childbirth protocols into one flowing process for all obstetric and childbirth scenarios
- Improved pain management options
 - Effectively doubled max fentanyl dosing
 - Allow ketamine co-administration with opioid



RESULTS

- Created a new length-based medication table for pediatrics longer than the traditional Length-Based Resuscitation Tape
- Increased the definition of an "unstable" patient to allow for paramedic clinical judgement
- Added new guidance for managing the increasing array of adjunct cardiac devices encountered in the prehospital setting
- Updated protocols with the newest science, including new traumatic brain injury, status epilepticus, and stroke assessments and treatments



RESULTS

- Additional vital sign metrics to identify sepsis and opioid overdose earlier
- Replaced dopamine with Push-Dose Epinephrine
- Removed nitroglycerin paste
- Reformatted all protocols





PROCESS

- > The Treatment Protocol Task Force met November 15, 2019
 - Comprehensive discussion, multiple drafts revisions
- > BSPC reviewed and endorsed multiple protocol updates in January and February 2020

PROCESS

- ➤ Following the early months of the pandemic, County EMS restarted the review process with a group of community representatives
- > AHA guidance updates published December
 - Informed many science-driven protocol changes

PROCESS

- The draft Adult protocols were presented to BSPC in January 2021
- Pediatric draft protocols in February for BSPC review and edits
- > Local Optional Scope renewals for cyanide treatments and ketamine completed in March
 - May 2021

- Community comments and input adapted in March and April
- Continuous intensive review for consistency throughout
- County EMS hosted special protocol review session April 23, 2021

March 2021

- Final drafting and reviews
- Local Optional Scope of Practice updates with EMDAC/EMSA

May 2021

- Final protocols and education material distribution
 - EMDAC Scope Subcommittee supports ketamine LOSOP changes

- Base Hospital Nurse Coordinators completed training material
- Agency provider training continues
- Final protocol, and other policy changes will be posted to EMS website in June
