# CRITERIA FOR PATIENT TRANSPORT TO VETERANS AFFAIRS (VA) MEDICAL CENTER EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT

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### I. PURPOSE

To define criteria for triage to alternate destination of patients who identify as veterans and request to be transported to a local Veterans Affairs (VA) Medical Center Emergency Department (ED) for treatment.

II. AUTHORITY: Sections 1797.107 and 1830, Health and Safety Code. Reference: Sections 1811, 1812, 1813, 1814, 1815, 1816, 1817, 1818, 1819, and 1820, Health and Safety Code. California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 9, Chapter 5, Sections 100181.

## III. DEFINITION(S)

**Veterans Affairs Medical Center Emergency Department (VA Medical Center ED):** A facility owned and operated by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs that provides emergency department services for eligible persons, i.e., veterans.

#### IV. POLICY

- **A.** Only paramedics who have completed a County-approved triage to alternate destination course may utilize this option.
- **B.** In all cases, the health and well-being of the patient is the primary consideration in determining patient destination. Factors to be considered include severity and stability of the patient's illness or injury; status of the receiving facility; anticipated transport time; requests by the patient, family, guardian, or physician; and EMS personnel and base hospital judgment.
- **C.** The patient must identify him/herself as a veteran and express a desire to be transported to the local VA Medical Center Emergency Department. A verbal attestation is sufficient for identification purposes.
- **D.** Triage paramedics shall screen the patient to ensure needs are met based on the criteria outlined below.

# San Diego County Emergency Medical Services Office Policy / Procedure / Protocol

1. If all criteria are met, triage paramedics shall confirm the destination with the base hospital prior to transport.

## V. ATTACHMENT: VA MEDICAL CENTER ED SCREENING TOOL

Patients must meet all criteria. Otherwise, transport the patient to the nearest appropriate facility.

The patient identifies him/herself as a veteran and requests to be transported to the VA Medical Center ED.

The patient is 17 years or older. \*

The patient **does not** require specialty care, e.g., pregnancy >20 weeks gestation, labor and delivery, pediatrics, major trauma, burn injury, STEMI, or stroke. †

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<sup>\*</sup> Servicemembers may be as young as 17 years old. Do not transport patients who are younger than 17 years old to the VA Medical Center ED.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>†</sup> The VA Medical Center ED is a Lanterman-Petris-Short (LPS)-designated facility that can receive psychiatric patients accompanied by law enforcement and Psychiatric Emergency Response Teams (PERT).
