# I. CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

## IV. COUNTY REPORT – Michael Assof, EMS Coordinator

• Monitoring the Effects of Hurricane Helene on the Medical Supply Chain:

The San Diego County EMS Office is monitoring the ongoing situation regarding Hurricane Helene and its significant impact on intravenous fluid manufacturing capacity, as detailed in a <u>recent press</u> release by <u>Baxter</u>. Baxter reported they are increasing the highest demand IV fluids for direct customers from 40% to 60% and for distributers from 10% to 60%, effective October 9.

- <u>2025 2026 EMS Treatment Protocols: Request for EMS Community Input:</u> The 2025-2026 EMS Treatment Protocol Revision cycle concluded on October 1. A survey was posted online from August 30 – October 1 for the EMS community to provide feedback on treatment protocols. The survey received over 60 responses from various system participants.

The next step is to review the public comments and incorporate any revisions into draft protocols. The draft protocols will be presented at the Base Station Physicians' Committee in early 2024.

 <u>New Requirement for Automated Cardiac Compression Devices on July 1, 2025:</u> As agencies were informed at the Base Station Physicians' Committee meeting in March, protocol S-103 language was revised to state that automated cardiac compression devices will become mandatory for all ALS ground ambulances on July 1, 2025. This requirement was included in the educational materials distributed to all EMS agencies with the revised protocols on May 1, 2024.

We are providing early notification of this requirement in appreciation of its substantial fiscal impact and the need for inclusion in the budgeting process for the next fiscal year.

<u>Statewide CA EMS Awards Nominations:</u>
