 - a. Emergency ambulance dispatches
 - b. PDI/PAIs provided
 - c. EMD triaged calls
 - d. Tiered dispatches
 - e. EMD continuing education courses provided
- 9. QA/QI outcomes, as contained in EMD QA/QI plan
- 10. Tiered dispatch response levels, including but not limited to
 - a. Code 2 dispatches
 - b. BLS dispatches, including Code 10 transports
 - c. Ambulance only dispatches
 - d. First responder only dispatches
 - e. In-alignment response priority/determinant level matches predicted onscene incident disposition
 - f. Out-of-alignment incident with response priority/determinant level and predicted on-scene incident disposition differ
