Re: Transition towards Standard Budget Position Titles

In an effort towards continuous improvement, CYF is requesting program assistance to create a standard naming convention for all budgeted positions. A standard naming convention more accurately communicates position function and qualifications through the use of a common language.

Please review the list below and align working titles with the standard titles for future budgets. This request is not asking programs to rename titles, but rather to follow a standard naming convention for budget submission. Recognizing that programs may utilize different working titles, please reference this by using a standard title followed by working title.

Example: LMHC/Therapist (Standard Title/Working Title)
