April 5th, 2022: Item 16: Gun Violence Reduction Program Update and Request to Issue a Competitive Solicitation for Community Needs Assessment

This gun violence community needs assessment will address the following key areas: (1) where gun violence is occurring
(impacted communities/neighborhoods); who is impacted by gun violence (populations); current/existing efforts to
address gun violence; gaps in programs and services; showcase linkages and gaps between agencies; perceived causes of
gun violence; and barriers to success and potential resolutions.

April 26th, 2022: Item 2: South County Trauma Recovery Services

Expansion to CARE center to provide trauma-focused services thru contract with Palomar Health and Rady's Children's
Hospital to provide trauma services. The focus population includes crime victims, human trafficking and domestic
violence survivors, reentry community members, at-risk youth and community members who need crime prevention an
intervention services. Anticipated to begin October 1, 2021.

April 26th, 2022: Item 12: San Pasqual Academy extension

Contract extension to operate the Academy previously authorized by the Board is set to expire on June 30, 2022. This
proposed action is to extend the contract term for nine months for the continued provision of specialty mental health
services to youth at the Academy from July 1, 2022 through March 31, 2023.







Who are we? What do we do?

- Storage Connect Center II offers a safe, secure, and protected space for individuals experiencing homelessness in San Diego to store their personal belongings completely free of charge as they look for potential employment opportunities, attend classes, meet with service providers or doctors, or otherwise attend to personal needs. Each program participant gains access to one 95-gallon lockable storage container. Participants may come to site during operating hours to access their storage containers and must check-in at least one time every 90 days to keep bin service active. The program is open 7 days a week.
- Storage Connect Center II's outreach staff inform individuals in the community about the program and its enrollment process. Staff link clients to potential housing opportunities, employment services, counseling services, resources for food and basic needs, and other services.
- In addition to storage, Storage Connect Center II provides important information and education to program participants.

Enhanced Outreach Program: NEW!

- On April 20th, 2022, Storage Connect Center II started its Enhanced Outreach Program.
- At least one time a week, Storage Connect Center II transports empty bins to designated outreach locations in the community.
- ▶ Individuals experiencing homelessness in San Diego may enroll for a bin and have their storage container transported back to the facility with their belongings inside.
- After initial intake, clients should come to Storage Connect Center II to utilize their bin and check in.
- Storage Connect Center II staff engage in wraparound services with individuals in the community to help them meet their needs.
