Chair's Report (Piedad Garcia)</li> <li>BHS Updates</li> <li>CCRT 23-24 Goals Review</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Behavioral Health Services Act Reform</li> <li>In March 2024, California will be voting on the reform on the Mental Health Services Act, which will be relabeled Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA)         Reform. The BHSA has major impacts for all the 58 counties across California, including San Diego County.</li> <li>Major Key Reforms is around the Fiscal Reform in BHS, including Substance Use and Mental Health, along with the inclusion for the integration for Substance Use System of Care.</li> <li>The Substance Use System of Care will be integrated and folded in the BHSA Reform. Once it passes, expected in March 2024. Implementation is will likely start in 2025 calendar year.</li> <li>SB 43 Reform</li> <li>The Board of Supervisors (BOS) approved the delay of the implementation in San Diego County of SB 43 last month.</li> <li>SB 43 is referring to the revision of LPS</li> </ul>	





	<ul> <li>Conservatorship has historically been for individuals with Mental Illness that may also have a co-occurring condition.</li> <li>The reform will include individuals with serious chronic substance use that will for the first time offer the service line for conservatorship.</li> <li>This calendar year, BHS will be doing the design, development, and implementation of SB 43 to be in effect 2025.</li> <li>Fiscal Reform</li> <li>BHS has been implementing BH Connect and CalAIM Reform.</li> <li>BHS has begun a soft rollout for the fiscal reform with Substance Use Residential treatment programs.</li> <li>BHS will also be implementing MCRT and CSU rates and implementing the Substance Use Outpatient bundle rates.</li> <li>BHS Reorganization</li> <li>In 2023, BHS initiated the transition of contracts to the different levels of care under the leadership of Deputy Directors</li> <li>Budget is over 1 billion dollars – As BHS grows, the reorganization was with that in mind.</li> <li>Dr. Garcia discussed new Deputy Directors (DDs) and their roles/programs leads.</li> <li>Continue to conduct clinical design meetings with Executive team and DDs – Purpose of the clinical design meetings is to review and analyze the current request for proposal with an eye to data driven programs, outcomes, and metrics.</li> <li>CCRT 23-24 Goals Review</li> <li>Dr. Garcia requests input on 2024 Presentations and 2024 Goals to finalize prior to next meeting.</li> <li>CCRT came to agreement with current list.</li> <li>Dr. Garcia requested to change Behavioral Health Act SB 43 Reform under 2024 Goals.</li> <li>Edith Mohler requested to have in-person meetings – it has been listed as an action item to have Quarterly in-person and monthly virtual meetings.</li> </ul>

## FY 2022-2023 Goals

- 1. Implementation of Cultural Competence (CC) Plan (Partially Completed)
  - a. Review of 3 LE's practices in implementing CLAS Standards in their programs (2 times/year)
    - o Request CC plans from representative sample of LE including MH, SU, and different size LE
    - E&T workgroup to complete reviews of CC plans and provide overall feedback to CCRT
      - Including strengths and areas that need further development
      - Review/compare available data to determine how LE's are meeting needs of community with respect to CC Plan
    - o BHS to make recommendations for LE COR instructed to communicate with contractors
    - Approximate Timeline: (Completed for 2 MH contractors)
      - Request CC plans in November 2022, review December 2022/January 2023, and present findings in February 2023; Request CC plans in March 2023, review April/May 2023, and present findings in June 2023
    - Provide input and feedback to BHS, including COR and QA, as well as Summary of Findings to Executive team (one pager) following each administration/review. (Completed)
- 2. Health Care Disparities
  - a. Community Experience Partnership (Liz Miles) TBD for 2024
    - o CCRT participation in community engagement focus groups
    - Participants: 1-2 members from E&T Workgroup to participate and provide updates to CCRT meeting as needed/available
  - b. Behavioral Health Equity Index (Liz Miles) (Completed)
    - In partnership with the Data Science team, E&T workgroup will review selected dashboard metrics (including one MH and SU) to inform membership of regional and system disparities
      - Include dashboard to address intersection between law enforcement and mental health
    - E&T to provide findings, including high level analysis of both strengths and areas for further development to CCRT
      - January 2023 and June 2023
      - Participants: E&T subcommittee
      - Input and Feedback provided to BHS
