IV.	Director's Update (Dr. Piedad Garcia)	 BHS is consistently putting out RFP (request for proposals) in the CYF System and Adult System of Care. BHS is in process of the request of proposals to renew contracts with clinical designs that are updated and is inclusive of best practices. Continuing with the Harm Reduction program, provided by Family Health Centers of San Diego. C-HRT shelter in the midway area is also provided by Family Health Centers of San Diego. BHS is working on finalizing a Safe Haven amendment. C-HRT All 44 beds are full currently. Family Health Centers of San Diego continue to provide outreach to those that are outside of the shelter. In operation for 8 months as of May 2022. Mobile Crisis Response Team (MCRT) BHS has signed the MOA with Law Enforcement for MCRT, which was an 18-month effort. Have rolled out all 11 Law Enforcement jurisdictions. Phase-1 has reached completion, with exception of the San Diego PD, and beginning Phase-2 of roll-out. Phase-2: School districts, Colleges/Universities, Fire rescue, and Tribal communities. 	





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	 In the midst of finalizing contract amendments for a joint effort with the City of San Diego. ✓ Developing the Sprung Structure in the midway area, that will provide from 125 to 150 short-term shelter beds for homeless clients.

BHS Workforce Workgroup Update (Marisa Varond/Dr. Diego Rogers)	 Under the leadership of the Board of Supervisors, particularly Chair Nathan Fletcher, there is a recognition of all the work that is being discussed to meet community needs. The San Diego Workforce Partnership have convened a group of about 15 individuals, who are representing different parts of the system of care. Those recommendations are in process and will be focused on a few different "work strings:" Increasing the diversity and representation of individuals within the Behavioral Workforce. Quality of life, such as flexible schedule and childcare.
