Chair's Report (Piedad Garcia)	 BHS – Behavioral Health Services BHS has been undergoing a reorganization for the last few years. ✓ Shifts in the Fiscal team, adding a Communications team and the Population Health unit. ✓ Under the leadership of Cecily Thornton-Stearns, BHS continues to hire Deputy Directors and Assistant Medical Services Administrators. During the last Behavioral Health Advisory Board, Dr. Bergmann and Nadia Privara presented on the Continuum of Care Board Letter. BHS is currently in the midst of the design for the Crisis Stabilization and Recovery and Bridge Services in the East Region. MCRT is countywide and live with Law Enforcement, referrals through 911 and ACL. Currently testing direct referrals from field officers with the 11 Law Enforcement Jurisdictions. Currently, Dr. Garcia and Alisha Eftekhari are part of a Statewide Collaborative that is led by California Behavioral Health Direct Association to begin to provide input and feedback to the calling option for billable services for MCRT. In addition, Charity and Alisha are currently taking the lead on developing a Tribal MCRT.
