All 16 recliners were available beginning January 2021. The South Region Hospital-Based CSU located at Paradise Valley Hospital became operational with 12 recliners in April 2021. The North Coastal Community-Based CSU in Vista became operational with 12 recliners in October 2021. The North Coastal Live Well Center Community-Based CSU in Coastal Live Well Center Coastal Live Well Cente	
		Oceanside is estimated to open in early 2022. When operational, this facility will have 12 recliners available. Launch of Mobile Crisis Response Teams (MCRTs) MCRTs provide a non-law enforcement, community-based crisis response designed to engage individuals in behavioral health services and reduce law enforcement interventions	
		 when clinically appropriate. MCRTs are comprised of clinicians, case managers, and peer support specialists to provide a clinician-only crisis intervention, triage for level of care need, link to appropriate behavioral health services, and if clinically indicated, transport to a crisis stabilization unit or walk-in assessment center as appropriate. 	
		MCRT began as a pilot program in January 2021 serving the North Coastal Region and as of today, MCRT is operational in
