IV. Chair's Report (Piedad Garcia)	 MCRT - Continuum of Care Grand opening Vista Crisis Stabilization Unit. Planning stage of opening the Mission Avenue Crisis Stabilization Unit in Oceanside – Opening in Fall. CSU's in North Inland and South Region with Paradise Valley. Part of the COC is to continue to develop additional CSUs in the East and in other regions, collaborating with UCSD being in the planning phase of EPU's (Emergency Psychiatric Unit). Telecare corporation has initiated the Mobile Crisis Response Team mobilization in the South Region, followed by the North Central region, receiving referrals from the South Region and North Central area currently. The 988 national number will replace the current crisis access line. Director's Update Implemented a transition team that will focus on discharges from hospitals to dedicated hospitals in the East and Central Region – Released a new RFP that will focus on hospitals. The County has established a County operated care coordination team, called Enhanced Care Coordination, which will be in line with CalAIM. CalAIM is the Medi-Cal reform for the state of California. The Enhanced Care Coordination is currently in the pilot phase, supported by Dr. Michael Krelstein and the Adult and Older Adult Unit. Homeless Outreach BHS working closely with San Diego Housing Commission and the City of San Diego to create a team that is focused on harm reduction named C-HRT.
