Workgroup identified the following five different work streams: Understanding the Needs Competitive Compensation Homeowner Incentives Tuition assistance, Loan Forgiveness and Stipends Expanding and Diverse the Pipeline Adult Council have an additional stream – Administrative Burden and Challenges in Workforce Retention.
