Presentation –Psychiatric Emergency Response Team by Wes Albers, Law Enforcement & Community Liaison	Psychiatric Emergency Response Team (PERT): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Liaison, Trainer & retired LEO. PERT has 28 years in SD County. • Four divisions • PERT patrol: Non-profit under CRF, 70 licensed MH Clinicians (Masters & PHD degrees), 65 clinicians allocated to patrol, countywide but not equally distributed (allocated based on data and demand) 55% of calls go to the City of SD (36 clinicians)

Faith based communities, in partnership with Behavioral Health Services, work to improve people’s lives through integration of body, mind, and spirit.



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clinicians go through Sheriff's backgrounds; no access to files by LEOs, but Clinicians have access to assist person in crisis. 1/3 of clinicians are bilingual. • PERT Homeless Outreach TEAM (HOT) – Relationship building, long term rapport building so when someone's ready they help. • Training LEOs on MH – CA municipal LE recognized CRF as state leader and provided certification number. • PERT Academy – Officers that want advanced training and work w/clinician regularly. • MCRT vs PERT – 911 dispatcher will triage and identify exclusionary info (harm, access to weapons, SI with plan, etc.). If no safety issue then MCRT diverted. All information shared by caller will be considered (insurance, care providers, history, situation, faith, etc.). No chaplains at PERT. Ability to call MCRT directly if you have all the information and no safety/risk concerns. 42K clinical contacts in the field last year; no clinical engagements with escalations (e.g., police shootings)
