VII. County Updates (Angel Vargas)	 HHSA Director, Nick Macchione is retiring. County Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Eric McDonald will serve as interim Agency Director. FY 23-24 HHSA Budget increased by \$3.2 billion and \$1.02 billion to BHS to increase services in mental health, inpatient, substance use, and administrative services for programs capacity and efficiency. BHS expanding its workforce. BHS shifting on how to handle crisis: <u>Goal:</u> eliminate hospital visits and control crisis at a lower level of care. Crisis stabilization unit created: Mobile Crisis Response Team (MCRT) <u>MCRT:</u> responds to individuals in crisis in the community to assess/stabilize and connect individuals to programs. Served over 4,000 referrals this year. Clinical facilities for individuals to be held for up to 24 hours – not considered 5150. Narcan is being distributed in the community. COSD initiatives are being recognized. National Association of Counties (NACo): 6 programs were nominated, and all were awarded. NAMI walk – over 2,000 attendees.
