SchooLink Background



SchooLink to Behavioral Health Services (SchooLink) is a partnership between the County of San Diego and local school districts to provide County-funded behavioral health services at schools.

The SchooLink training program shares successful strategies for linking eligible school-aged children and youth to behavioral health services.

It was developed in 2017-2018 through a highly collaborative and interactive process between the County of San Diego's Health and Human Services Agency's (HHSA) Behavioral Health Services Division (BHS), San Diego Unified School District's (SDUSD) Mental Health Resource Center (MHRC), Community Research Foundation (CRF), and Price Philanthropies.
