Student Worker

Undergraduate, Graduate/Tech and High School — Are you a full-time student looking to gain valuable internship experience in your field of study? Apply now! Applicants must be full-time students at a local high school, vocational program, job readiness program, or an accredited college or university with at least a 2.0 semester/quarter grade point average.

Residential Care Worker

This role works with children from birth to age 17 at the Polinsky Children's Center (PCC), a 24-hour temporary emergency shelter care facility for children who are separated from their families for their own safety or when parents cannot provide care. Employees at PCC provide a consistent, high level of care as well as assure the health, safety and well-being of children at all times.

Residential Child Care Specialist

Provides care for children at PCC, especially those under six years of age; observes and documents behavior, development and needs of children.

Social Worker I, II, III

Performs casework services that include assessing social service needs, making appropriate referrals, and providing information to individuals eligible for social services.

Protective Services Worker

Performs investigations, consultation and casework for children. Investigates and evaluates allegations of abuse or neglect, recommends placement services to children placed in a protective services program.
