# **Request for an Independent Guardianship**

### **Policy**

When a Hotline SW or other SW receives a call requesting or inquiring about Probate guardianship, it will be evaluated as follows:

If	Then
<ul> <li>There is no protective issue,</li> <li>The child is <b>not</b> living with the parent, <b>and</b></li> <li>No other courts are involved</li> </ul>	Refer the caller to Probate Court at (619) 844-2676 (M-F 8:30 am - 11:30 am) or www.sdcourt.ca.gov.
There is a protective issue	If received by the SW, complete the 04-184, CWS Suspected Child Abuse Report, and send it to the Hotline at <a href="Mailto:CARCWS.HHSA@sdcounty.ca.gov">CARCWS.HHSA@sdcounty.ca.gov</a> If received by the Hotline, complete a referral and assign it according to the level of risk to appropriate region.

**NOTE:** Do not instruct relatives/petitioners to seek temporary guardianship if the child is **still in the physical custody of the parent**. A possible exception to this rule is children over the age of 12 who have valid reasons for wanting to live with the relatives/petitioners.

#### **Hotline action**

The following are examples of situations in which the Hotline might refer a caller for information about Probate guardianship:

- There is a history of general neglect referrals that does not warrant the services of Juvenile Court, and the parent is willing to allow a Probate guardianship.
- The parent has a history of substance abuse involvement that limits the parent's ability to provide adequate care for the child and the parent is willing to allow a Probate guardianship.
- The parents state they do not wish to, or are unable to, care for the child and are willing for a specific person to assume a Probate guardianship.

The following examples involve a potential protective issue, so the Hotline will create a referral and assign it for investigation. They will not be EO'd/referred to Probate Court:

- The child has been left with a relative or another person and the parent's whereabouts are unknown.
- The parent has a history of substance abuse involvement that limits the parent's ability to provide adequate care for the child and the parent is willing to allow a Probate guardianship.

**NOTE:** The relative must prove search efforts to locate the parents.

### Procedure

The Hotline will follow this procedure to process a request for a Probate guardianship:

Step	Action
1	Refer the caller to:  • www.sdcourt.ca.gov (direct them to the Probate tab), OR  • Probate Business Office Central Courthouse 1100 Union St. San Diego, CA 92101 (619) 844-2676, M-F 8:30 am - 11:30 am
2	Complete the 04-270, Voluntary Guardianship Letter, and include the SW's name and telephone number. If there is no assigned SW, use the Hotline SW's name and telephone number.
3	Mail the 04-270 and JV-350, Guardianship Pamphlet, to the caller.

## Procedure (cont.)

Step	Action
4	<ul> <li>Advise the caller of the following resources:</li> <li>Office of the Family Law Facilitator Guardianship Assistance         Program, which holds informational workshops on guardianships, and assists with completion of guardianship forms, filing objections, and terminating guardianships.     </li> </ul>

	San Diego Volunteer Lawyer Program conducts a Guardianship Clinic to assist relative and non-relative caretakers in obtaining legal guardianship of children. The program also helps with objections to guardianship, requesting termination of guardianship, seeking visitation orders and other concerns.

	Walk-in Guardianship Clinic Tuesdays and Thursdays from 12 pm - 5pm except on court holidays at SDVLP office.

	<b>NOTE:</b> SWs will not assist with the paperwork nor give legal advice.
