Background

Senate Bill 113 was passed to allow online voter pre-registration for eligible 16 and 17 year olds. California eligible youth are now able to pre-register by applying through the registertovote.ca.gov. Online pre-registration allows eligible California youth to complete the online voter registration form providing sufficient time and opportunity to get them ready to vote.

Voter pre-registration

Voter pre-registration is available to California youth who are 16 or 17 years old and meet the following criteria:

- A United States citizen
- A resident of California
- Not current imprisoned or on parole for the conviction of a felony and
- Not prohibited from voting by a court because of mental incompetency.

Pre-registration:

- does not change the voting age, which is still 18 years old.
- should always reflect the youth's current residence.

If a youth moves, the youth will need to update their pre-registration application. If a youth have only moved temporarily, the youth can continue to use the permanent residence whether the youth had pre-registered to vote.

Voter registration

To register to vote in California, youth/NMDs must be:

- A United States citizen and a resident of California
- 18 years old or older on Election Day,
- Not currently in state or federal prison or on parole, for the conviction of a felony (for more information, refer to <u>Voting Rights: Persons with a Criminal History</u>), and
- Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court (for more information, refer to <u>Voting Rights: Persons Subject to Conservatorship</u>).

Youth/NMDs can apply for pre-registration or general registration by completing one of the following.

- Online application at http://registertovote.ca.gov.
- Voter Registration Card (VRC) application, which is available at <u>local county elections</u> offices, <u>libraries</u>, Department of Motor Vehicles (<u>DMV</u>) offices, or <u>U.S. Post Offices</u>.

SW staff may assist with completing either applications, and may provide a VRC application to a youth/NMD.
