## Traveling Abroad? Protect Against Measles



Before you travel internationally, make sure you are up-to-date on your measles-mumpsrubella (MMR) vaccines.





Get an early dose at 6-11 months. Follow the recommended schedule and get another dose at 12-15 months and a final dose at 4-6 years.

## **CHILDREN 12 MONTHS & OLDER**

with no evidence of immunity\*



Get first dose immediately. Get second dose 28 days after first dose.

## **TEENS & ADULTS**

with no evidence of immunity\*



Get first dose immediately. Get second dose 28 days after first dose.

\*Evidence of immunity includes one of the following: Written documentation of adequate vaccination, laboratory evidence of immunity, laboratory confirmation of measles, birth in the United States before 1957.

Plan to be fully vaccinated against measles at least 2 WEEKS before you travel. If your trip is less than 2 weeks away, you should still get a dose of MMR vaccine.
