
Human Papillomavirus (HPV) & Cancer





HPV is so common that nearly **85%** of individuals will contract the virus unless vaccinated.



The most common HPV-related cancer in boys is throat cancer.



HPV is the **#1 cause of cervical cancer** in females.



Vaccination could prevent more than 90% of cancers caused by HPV from ever developing.

ROUTINE VACCINATION: Age 11-15 years, can be started as early as 9 years

CATCH-UP VACCINATION:
Age 15-26 years if not
already vaccinated



2 doses of vaccine 6-12 months apart

3 doses of vaccine 6-12 months apart



Prevention is Key 0

Due to how common HPV is, it is difficult to prevent it without getting vaccinated. The Gardasil 9 series can be started as early as 9 years old and can prevent up to 90% of HPV-related cancers from ever developing.
