BL#1 Netsmart Contract (Public Health Information System) – Nick Yanischeff	 Nick Yanischeff provided an overview of the Public Health Information System (PHIS). As PHS system needs have grown since 2001, Public Health Services (PHS) has utilized PHIS for programs throughout the county. Modules for PHS programs have been added to PHIS over the past 15 years and currently the system is in the process of having interfaces with other systems as part of the ConnectWellSD so that data can be shared with other departments within the county and other stakeholders. The contract will implement new components, such as interfaces with other systems to avoid duplicate data entry, improve accuracy and develop Electronic Health Record (EHR) capabilities to reduce the need for paper patient charts and records. Questions/ comments from Board member: How does PHIS interface with KIP? Nick responded that ConnectWellSD is the new name for what formerly known as the Knowledge Integration Project or KIP, and the proposed contract will have components that include the ability to create two-way interface between PHIS and ConnectWellSD. 	The HSAB members recommended supporting the Board of Supervisors to approve the Netsmart Technologies, Inc. contract for Public Health Information System and to pursue future funding opportunities related to the maintenance and support of Public Health Information System. Adriana Andrés-Paulson and 2 nd by Jack Rogers. All approved. No abstentions.

BL#2 Single Source Procurement: Childhood Obesity Initiative Contract Chesley Blevins,



- Chesley Blevins requested board members to approve the board letter that would approve the extension of the existing contract with Community Health Improvement Partners (CHIP) that is expiring in June 30, 2016. The contract with CHIP was implemented in December 13, 2005 and was extended on March 24, 2009 and October 9, 2012 and the overall goal of the contract is to prevent childhood obesity epidemic in San Diego.
- Chesley Blevins presented the following facts:
 - Childhood obesity is a growing epidemic in the United States.
 - Obesity has more than doubled in children and quadrupled in adolescents in the past 30 years.

The HSAB members recommended to the Board of Supervisors to approve to enter into negotiations with CHIP regarding the COI and to increase their funding.

	■ The percentage of children aged 6 to 11 years in the United States who were obese increased from seven percent in 1980 to nearly eighteen percent in 2012.	
	Similarly, the percentage of adolescents aged 12 to 19 years who were obese increased from five percent to nearly twenty-one percent over the same period.	
	 More than one third of children and adolescents in the United States were overweight or obese in 2012. 	
	 In San Diego County, childhood obesity rates have been declining since 2005; however, more than one third of children in the County are still overweight or obese. 	
	Questions/ comments from Board members:	
	Bob Prath stated he has a conflict of interest due to being co-chair domain champion and the leadership counsel. This group has done an amazing job in coordinating all the stakeholders in San Diego. Growing very quickly and can address these needs. CHIP plays the backbone in making	

	 this happen and fully supports this initiative. What metrics are being used to assess the successful program? Chesley stated that evaluation plan is in place but needs to be updated; some metrics are common goals, such as increase access to physical activities; reducing consumption of sugar sweetened beverages; pilot program evaluations; purchasing habits, and consumption of unhealthy food. Dr. Wooten commented on the 3.7% reduction in the Childhood Obesity in the Southern California region in 2010. With the policy systems and environmental changes that the initiatives is conducting through partnership.
