

Health and Human Services Agency Health Services Advisory Board (HSAB) Public Health Officer's Report November 17, 2016 * 3-5PM 1600 Pacific Highway, SD 92101

I. Communicable Disease Issues

A. Infectious Disease Issues

1. Zika Virus

- San Diego now has capacity to test for Zika with PCR only (not for IgM and IgG)
- Total Zika Testing referrals to EPI Program for consultation of potential cases: 682 cases
 (580 in October), with 497 cases ruled out for Zika.
- Confirmed Zika cases (all travel-associated): 64 (60 in October)
- Cases pending lab results or submission: 109 cases pending results.
- Travel associated cases: American Samoa (1), Belize (1), Brazil (2), Caribbean (multiple islands) (1), Central America (1), Columbia (2), Costa Rica (4), Dominican Republic (2), Grenada (1), Guatemala (3), Haiti (1), Jamaica (2), Kiribati (1), Mexico (21), Nicaragua (7), Puerto Rico (3), Saint. Lucia (1), Singapore (1), Trinidad (3), Venezuela (3), and sexual transmission from a traveler (1).
- Again, all reported cases are imported; 0 cases confirmed in pregnant women.
- There are now 24 (19 in October) Mexican states with documented local Zika transmission, but documented outbreak in Sonora, but NOT in Baja California.
- CDC has created a US Zika Pregnancy Registry for local, state, and territorial health departments
- To date, none of the invasive Aedes species detected have tested positive for Zika.
- Focus in on education and outreach, case reporting, and prevention of mosquito breeding

2. West Nile Virus Infections

- Number of <u>confirmed</u> WNV infection cases = 13 (includes 11 symptomatic cases and 2 asymptomatic blood donors)
 - Two cases are deaths.
- Number of probable WNV infections cases = 6
 - Three cases have a final classification as probable.
 - Three cases await test results from CDPH
- Number of <u>suspect</u> WNV infection cases pending confirmatory testing at CDPH VRDL = 3 (symptomatic).
- As of 11.10.16, CDPH listed 388 (+8) human WNV disease cases and 38 (+1) asymptomatic WNV-positive blood donors in 29 counties in California, including 17 (+1) deaths. http://www.westnile.ca.gov/
- CDPH has 17 human WNV disease cases listed for San Diego so far this season, and 2 symptomatic blood donors for a total of 19 WNV infections.
- As of 11.8.16, there have been 1,521 cases of WNV disease in the US reported to ArboNet, including 71 deaths. http://www.cdc.gov/westnile/statsmaps/preliminarymapsdata/histatedate.html

3.Invasive Meningococcal Disease (IMD) among Southern California Men Who Have Sex with Men (MSM)

No cases have been reported to date in San Diego County.

 - Transition of Care (TOC) module from First Watch has been procured by the County. Roll-out being planned.
 - Request presentation on HSAB Agenda in early 2017

- 1. March of Dimes \$10.000-\$15.000: Not Awarded
- 2. Dental Transformation Initiative \$94,645 for 5 years

B. Funded

- 1. Sodium Reduction Initiative:
 - Agreement in process of completion (FY16/17, 17/18, 18/19, 19/20, 20/21)
 - Partnering with LAHD on new Sodium reduction grant. Local focus: School districts and health care systems. Application submitted last week. \$100K/year X 5 years. AWARDED

2. SNAP-ED:

- Program is currently in the 1st of the next 3-year cycle (FY16/17,17/18,18/19)
- Submitted next 3-year cycle application and work plan; activities will continue to focus on policy, systems, and environmental change for nutrition and PA
- 3. Prevention (Public Health Actions to Prevent Obesity, Diabetes, Heart Disease and Stroke): funded to work in the City of San Diego geographic area
 - Components
 - 1: For implementing food sodium standards and environment and <u>lifestyle changes</u> (DPPs) excited about the development of the Diabetes Prevention Programs
 - 2: Diabetes prevention and <u>community clinical linkages</u>; health system interventions Chronic Disease Surveillance via EHRs
 - Summited Year 3 application and work plan on April 30th.

 - A. Proposition 64: Adult Use Marijuana Act (AUMA) Passed
 - 1.Impact/Changes
 - Fee has changed to \$100 for regular (non-Medi-Cal) clients (\$166 previously), and \$50 for Medi-Cal clients (\$83 previously)
 - Fee shall be waived for medically indigent adults
 - General Counsel evaluating fee changes and the potential for cost recovery
 - Need to revise Vital Records' database fields to eliminate client demographic information
 - B. Proposition 56: California Healthcare, Research and Prevention Tobacco Tax Act of 20161.Impact/Changes
 - Likely expansion of current tobacco control program activities
 - New tobacco tax effective April 2017; it is anticipated the revenue will show up in the California Tobacco Control Program's fiscal year 2017/18 budget. Direct program funding impact is still pending.
