<b>III. Discussion</b>	<p>Dr. Thomas Coleman, Chief, Maternal, Child, and Family Health Services, presented an overview of current chronic disease Health and Human Services Agency grants and projects. He highlighted Healthy Works, and initiatives related to teen smoking cessation, obesity prevention and healthy nutrition, sodium consumption decrease, and lactation support. Several grants are up for renewal and applications have been submitted. Alison Sipler, Director of Chronic Disease and Health Equity Unit, augmented some of Dr. Coleman’s comments. Dr. Coleman emphasized the 3-4-50 concept and enthusiastically discussed the need for modifying the Social Determinants of Health as the key strategy in chronic disease prevention.</p> <p>LaVonna Connelly emphasized the importance of the Resident Leadership Academy in creating an informed public and community advocacy. Dr. Afflalo emphasized the importance of decreasing Health Equity barriers in preventing and treating chronic disease. Dr. Harris spoke about the Stand Down Homeless Vet project as an example of rapid implementation of addressing a serious problem.</p> <p>The subcommittee was unable to recommend a specific disease entity to be the focus of HSAB advocacy. Strategies for primordial and primary prevention through advocacy for enhancing social determinants of Health (SDH) is the general consensus direction discussed, but further recommendations will be discussed at the next meeting.</p>			8/7/18
