## FUNDING

- State General Fund
- County Realignment

- California Code of Regulations Title 17, Sections 6800-6874 and Title 22, Sections 51340-51532
- Budget Act of 1999 and California Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 16501.3 and 16010 (foster care)
- California Education Code Section 49452.8 (dental)

# CHDP PROGRAM OUTCOMES FY 22-23



- **CHDP**
  - Facilitated 13,000 CHDP well-child exams
  - Certified, monitored, and trained 150 providers representing 718 physicians and non-physician medical practitioners
- **HCPCFC**
  - 1,590 average clients served
  - 92.5% received timely medical exams
  - 81.7% received timely dental exams

# CHDP PROGRAM OUTCOMES FY 22-23



- **DHI/STC**

- 123 children received screenings and referrals to community dental clinics and Federally Qualified Health Centers
  - 119 children received fluoride varnish applications
  - 67 children received dental sealants
- 83 health care professionals, representing 14 medical offices, were trained on oral health and fluoride varnish applications

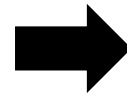


# CHILD HEALTH AND DISABILITY PREVENTION PROGRAM



## CHALLENGES

- Program sunsets on July 1, 2024
- Lack of funding for the Oral Health-Dental Health Initiative activities
- Need for additional funding to cover HCPCFC administrative support



## SOLUTIONS

- Work closely with State, local Managed Care Plans, and other counties to seamlessly transition services
- Absorb staffing and shift to other funding sources
- Shift Dental Health Initiative activities to the County's Oral Health Program
- Promote shifting of CHDP funds to HCPCFC to cover administrative costs
- Leverage resources with community partners and seek additional funding

# RECOMMENDATIONS



1. Waive Board Policy B-29, Fees, Grants, Revenue Contracts – Department Responsibility for Cost Recovery, which requires prior approval of revenue agreement applications and full cost recovery of grants
2. Approve and authorize the Clerk of the Board to execute the Fiscal Year 2023-24 State Child Health and Disability Prevention Certification Statement
3. Approve and authorize the Clerk of the Board to execute the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 through Fiscal Year 2027-2028 Health Care Program for Children in Foster Care Certification Statement

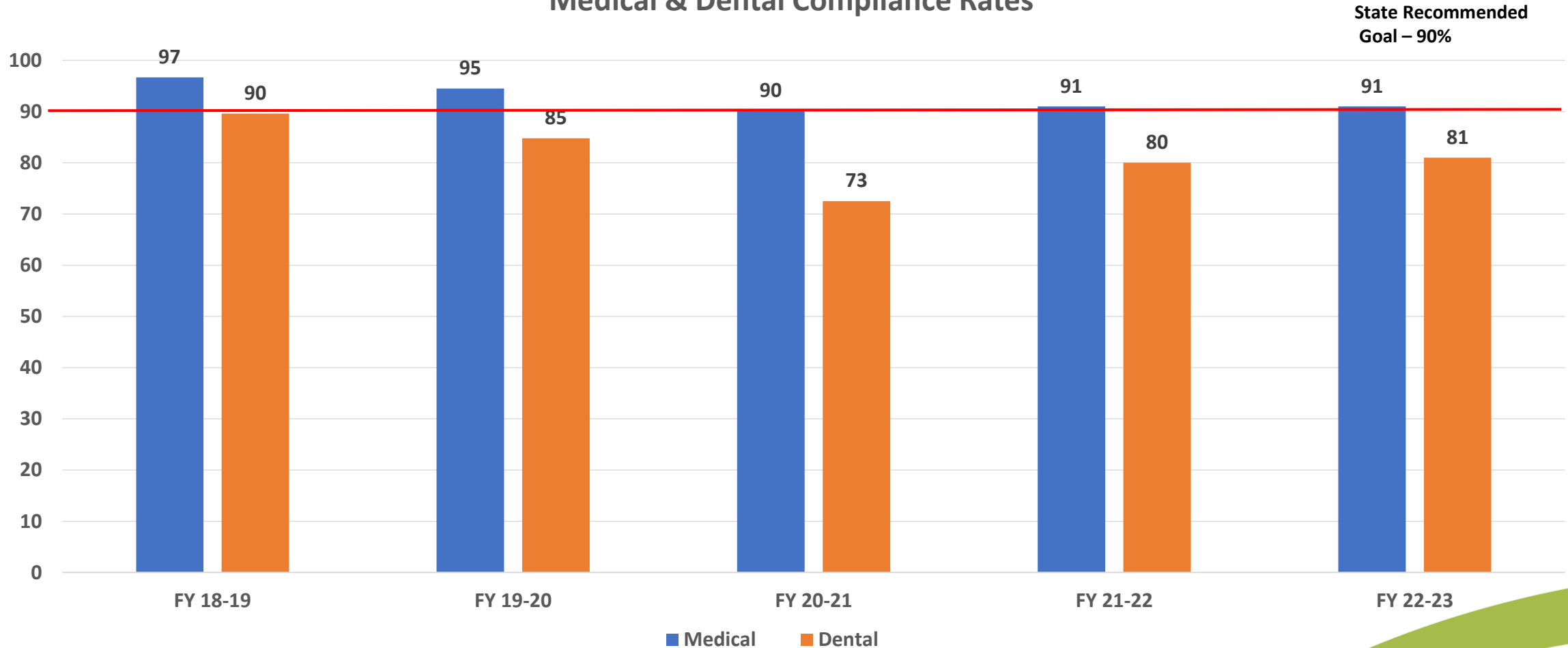

### Medical & Dental Compliance Rates



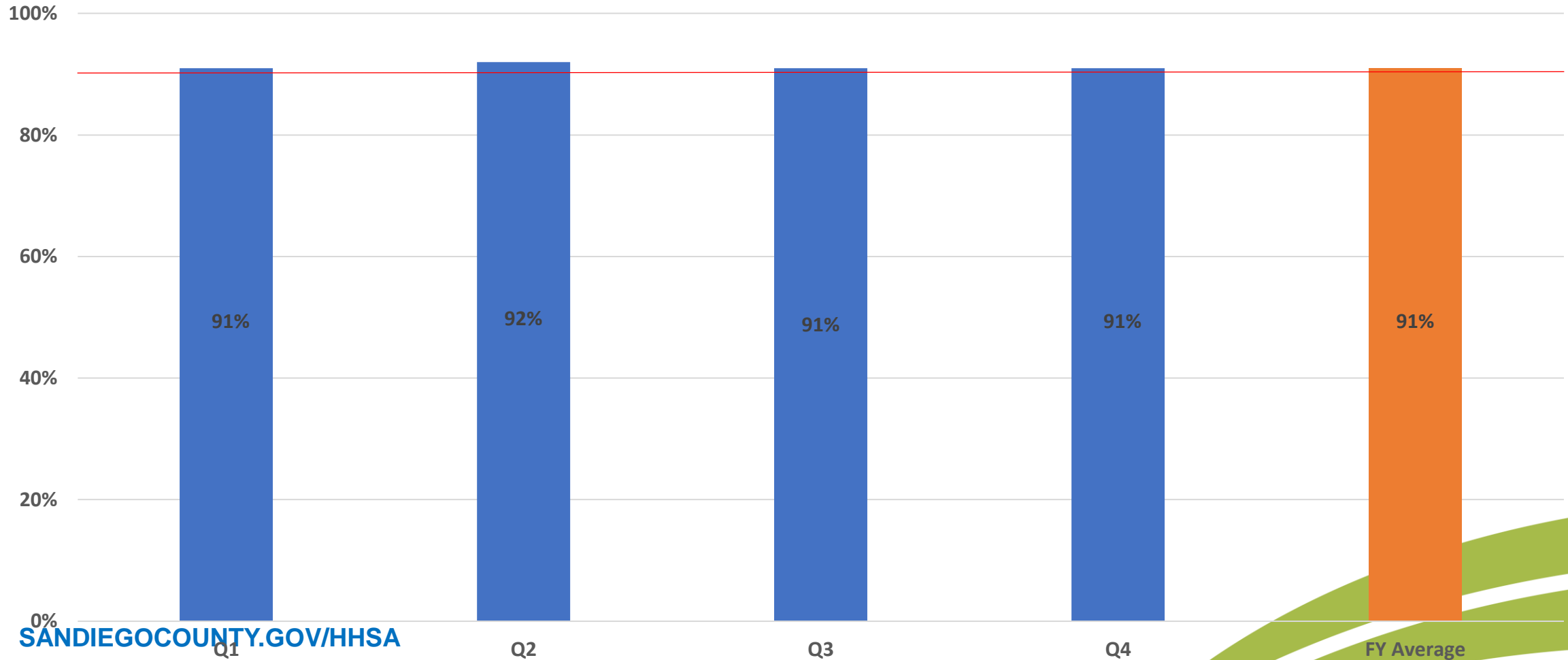
