Background – Getting to Zero



Getting to Zero

- On March 1, 2016, the Board of Supervisors adopted the local Getting to Zero initiative, a comprehensive and ambitious plan to end the HIV epidemic.

Ending the HIV Epidemic

- Federal initiative started in 2019 with the goal of reducing new HIV infections in the U.S. by 90% by 2030.

Extension of Ryan White Part A Contracts

- Supports medical treatment and support services for people living with HIV
- Coordinated HIV Services
- Emergency Housing Assistance and Partial Assistance Rental Subsidy



Competitive Procurement



Procurement of HIV Prevention Services

- Updated HIV prevention guidance provided by CDC/CDPH in 2024
- New services forecasted to begin by January 1, 2026



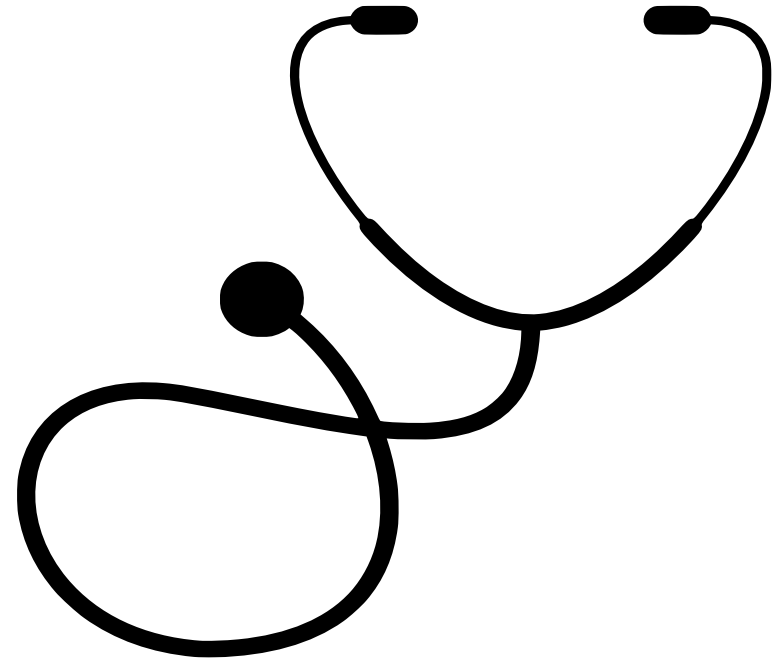
Acceptance of Ryan White Part B Funding



Ryan White Part B funding supports medical treatment and support services for people living with HIV.

Funding period: April 1, 2024-March 31, 2029.

Funding amount: \$11.6 million.



Recommendations



Board Letter Recommendations

- Waive Board Policy B-29.
- Extend HIV Prevention contracts.
- Issue competitive solicitations for HIV Prevention services.
- Extend Ryan White Part A contracts.
- Accept Ryan White Part B funding.
- Authorize application for future funding opportunities and submit required reports or applications for continuation.
