Expanded opportunities for low-income individuals, families and communities to access healthy and affordable food options



- Distributed <u>1,655</u> emergency food assistance packets
- Assisted <u>2,268</u> individuals to <u>access</u>

Resident Leadership Academy graduates pursued Community Improvement Projects focused on food security, including:

- Planning installation of ECOLIFE aquaponics system (North Central);
- Development of video on healthy food choices for residents in Southeastern San Diego (Central)

Provided opportunities for low-income youth and their families to engage in activities that support safety and well-being



Recruited 75 youth from socially and economically disadvantaged backgrounds to participate in the Work Readiness Training & Hiring Event and placed 50 into paid externships

Enrolled 64 at-risk youth into Gang Prevention & Community Response services, providing access to mentors with lived experience to help them navigate away from and out of gang life



Increased the number of low-income residents engaged in activities that improve the health, safety and well-being of their communities



Facilitated 6 Resident Leadership Academies countywide, graduating 65 trained resident leaders engaged in community improvement projects to increase health, safety and economic vitality in the region

Hosted 8 RLA Supplemental Training Series to support next steps for graduates, including topics like:

- Grant Writing
- · Social Determinants of Health
- · Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design
- Grassroots Evaluation
- Boards & Commissions

Provided 390 hours of hands-on Technical Assistance provided to small, minority owned businesses to help them advance their strategic and business plans.

Provided community level support to local law enforcement and other stakeholders to improve safety outcomes

Mediated 1,314 cases referred to the Alternative Dispute Resolution program, helping to resolve conflict outside of court in a non-adversarial method.

Trained 651 individuals on collaborative communication and conflict resolution through the Live Well San Diego Exchange
