- 2. The April 10, 2024 Meeting Minutes were approved, with all Board Members present voting yes.
- 3. Public Comments:
 - No public comment

- 4. Presentation Item: 24/25 Proposed Operational Plan Budget Presentation: Rissa Japlit, Assistant Group Finance Director, Financial & Support Services Division, Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA). Ms. Japlit presented an outlook on the State budget, highlighting that the State faces a serious budget problem in 2024-25, including the reductions in various CalWORKs programs. She also shared a breakdown of the HHSA Budget of \$3.4 Billion by Department, the significant budget adjustments, and shared a QR code for the community to engage and attend upcoming budget events.
- 5. Information Item: Review Legislative Advocacy Bills that Support SSAB Strategic Priorities: Assmaa Elayyat, Deputy Director, Self-Sufficiency Services, Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA). Ms. Elayyat shared a draft letter of support to the Board of Supervisor regarding AB 2141. Vice Chair Jan Spencley suggested an edit to strengthen the emphasis on the reduction of administrative costs for the County. Ms. Elayyat also brought forward AB 2241 to present to the Members. All Members present voted yes to move forward with advocacy.

A public comment was made by Mauricio Medina of the San Diego Hunger Coalition, thanking Assmaa for bringing forward the opportunity to weigh in on a critical bill, AB 2241 as the San Diego Hunger Coalition also supports this bill. He also expressed that he is thankful to the Board for the vote to join in on the advocacy.

6. Information Item: Update on Medi-Cal Renewals, PHE Lift for Public Assistance Programs, Waivers, Enrollment, Service Delivery, Data: Assmaa Elayyat, Deputy Director, Self-Sufficiency Services, Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA). Ms. Elayyat provided an update on the County's Opt-in for additional BenefitsCal features, stating that Two-way messaging, Click to chat and Call me are still being reviewed for technical feasibility by CalSAWS. She also shared updates on Medi-Cal and CalWORKs programs, focusing mainly on CalFresh awareness month. Ms. Elayyat also provided updates on a variety of monthly reports.




FY 24/25 State Budget Impacts Overview



Dear Chairwoman Vargas,

I am writing to you on behalf of the Social Services Advisory Board (SSAB). In an effort to reduce the risk of electronic benefit theft that has impacted San Diego County's most vulnerable residents and reduce unnecessary spending to address electronic theft, I would like to highlight Assembly Bill (AB) 2141 for the San Diego County Board of Supervisors to support.

Cash assistance programs including Cash Assistance for Aged, Blind, and Disabled Immigrants (CAPI), California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) are administered by the County on behalf of the California Department of Social Services. These programs are vital in ensuring our most vulnerable residents are able to meet their basic needs for shelter, clothing, and other essential necessities. Under existing law, cash benefits are issued through the statewide Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) system, but for cash benefits, recipients can choose to have funds directly deposited into a qualified account of their choice.

AB 2141 would require statewide adoption of allowing for CalWORKs, CAPI, and General Relief issuance through direct deposit and require that applications for cash assistance programs to include information on the application regarding an applicant's right to receive their benefits through direct deposit or be issued on an EBT card. This bill would also require Counties to inform recipients of their options during their redetermination for eligibility which occurs once every 12 months. San Diego County has already implemented this practice and by allowing customers across the State of California the option to opt for direct deposit for cash assistance, this significantly reduces the risk of electronic benefit theft. Additionally, bill will reduce administrative costs associated with addressing EBT theft occurrences, as well as ensure greater fiscal responsibility with tax dollars.

For the reasons indicated above, I request San Diego County actively support AB 2141. As Chair of the SSAB, I am writing to recommend that the San Diego Board of Supervisors actively support this request.

Dear Chairwoman Vargas,

I am writing to you on behalf of the Social Services Advisory Board (SSAB). Over the last year, San Diego County's Health and Human Services Agency, Self-Sufficiency Services, has been committed to identifying and reducing barriers facing applicants and recipients of public safety net programs. Through this process, the Eligibility Task Force was established and worked with several community partners and a County contracted consultant to identify and implement on-going solutions for barriers that applicants and recipients experience.

Part of those recommendations prioritized by the Eligibility Task Force include expanding communication pathways by encouraging both applicants and recipients and the County to communicate via methods that are most preferred by customers. Senate Bill (SB) 2241 proposes codifying the ability for customers and the County to communicate via different methods, including phone, in-person, by mail, or by electronic means including, but not limited to, secured e-mail, thus allowing customers better opportunities to correspond with the County and reduce unnecessary barriers. The bill would further protect customer confidentiality by requiring State or County agencies that receive information through unsecure channels to inform the customer of a privacy concern and provide reasonable alternative methods for resubmitting the information. Historically, communication methods or pathways have been limited under State policy or law, thus the passage of this bill would help greatly reduce communication barriers faced by customers while ensuring adherence to confidentiality guidelines and requirements.

For the reasons indicated above, we request San Diego County actively support SB 2241. As Chair of the SSAB, I am writing to recommend that the San Diego Board of Supervisors actively support this request.

Message from the Interim Agency Director

Dear Agency Team,

This week, we presented the <u>CAO's Recommended Budget</u> for Fiscal Year 2024-25 to the Board of Supervisors. Our proposed Agency budget protects core services and supports the incredible work you do to help San Diegans live well. Over the next several weeks, our submissions will likely be modified based on feedback from the Board, public input, as well as potentially significant changes to State funding available to the County.

As you may know, 85 percent of the Agency's budget is funded by the State and federal government. It is those dollars that pay for most of the programs and services we provide. The largest portion of the <u>state budget</u>, about 38 percent, is dedicated to health and human services spending.

Last Friday, days before our presentation to the Board, the Governor released state budget updates, referred to as the "May Revision" or "May Revise." The revision forecasts a statewide budget shortfall of \$44.9 billion for the 2024-25 fiscal year, which is \$7 billion more than when the Governor proposed his budget in January. To address this updated shortfall, the Governor is now proposing to trim State funding for a number of programs, many of which impact services the Agency provides. The official summary of the Governor's revised budget can be found <u>here</u>.

What does this mean for the Agency? If the Governor's current proposal stands, we will get less money from the State in many service areas, with especially significant reductions proposed in public health and CalWORKs funding.

In our budget presentation to the Board on Tuesday, I emphasized the critical work the Agency does daily to advance the health and well-being of our communities. We are not alone in facing the challenges posed by the State's budget shortfall, and we will work closely with the larger County organization to find creative solutions. In addition, with support from the County Economic Development and Government Affairs Office, we are engaged in advocating against the proposed cuts. As an example of this advocacy, a letter from Chairwoman Vargas to the State legislative leadership about the May Revise may be found <u>here</u>.

While we work to mitigate these potential shortfalls, I want to be transparent that this could result in impacts to community services. As the County team works to further analyze the May Revision impacts and monitor the results of our advocacy, we will provide further communication as we get more clarity and information from the State level.

But please be assured, this is not the first-time State funding has fluctuated. We have been through this before, and we came out stronger as an Agency and County government. We approached this year's budget expecting the outlook for the state would be challenging. Therefore, our proposed budget already takes several steps to mitigate anticipated budget shortfalls, including leveraging available one-time funding to help maintain essential services while we work on longer term solutions.

Starting this week, the California State Assembly and Senate will have the opportunity to review and consider the Governor's budget. Together, we will advocate that the State reverses key funding reductions in health and human services. The next major deadline will be June 15. That's when the Legislature is scheduled to approve and present to the Governor a balanced budget.

While there are more conversations to be had in the weeks ahead, please know that we will continue to focus on our core services while staying committed to the Agency's mission to make people's lives healthier, safer, and self-sufficient by delivering essential services in San Diego County. We will also continue to share critical updates with this Agency team.

Monthly Self-Sufficiency Services Performance Dashboard (FY 23/24)









