- 1. Meeting called to order at 9:32 by Chair, Vino Pajanor.
- 2. The May 10, 2023 Meeting Minutes were approved, with 6 Board Members present voting yes, and 1 member abstaining.
- 3. Public Comments:
 - No public comment

- 4. **Presentation Item:** BenefitsCal Demonstration: Amy Klock, Human Services Program Manager, CalSAWS Implementation Support, Self-Sufficiency Services, Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA). Ms. Klock and Mr. Emmanuel Molina presented an overview and demo of the new BenefitsCal website and how the Community Based Organizations (CBOs) can utilize it to submit applications, upload documents, check application statuses, view reports of activities, as well as create referral campaigns and staff accounts.

Mr. Banuelos provided an overview and discussion on a draft Letter of Legislative Advocacy regarding AB 843.

A public comment was made by Mauricio Medina, Public Affairs Manager of San Diego Hunger Coalition, expressing his gratitude for the County's advocacy work, including AB 843 and AB 311. He requested to bump up AB 712 CalFresh: hot and prepared foods, as a priority. He also asked support from the County to advocate for the State Governor to include SB 600 in his priorities.

A motion to approve the Letter of Legislative Advocacy regarding AB 843 was made by the Vice-Chair Jan Spencley and 2nd by Robin Maxson, with all 7 Board Members present voting yes.

7. **Information Item:** Update on PHE Lift for Public Assistance Programs, Waivers, Enrollment, Service Delivery, Data: Assmaa Elayyat, Deputy Director, Self-Sufficiency Services, Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA). Mr. Banuelos shared updates on program flexibilities and waivers CalFresh, Medi-Cal and CalWORKs programs. He also shared the updated Legislative Log, CBO Referral Report and introduced the new Monthly Medi-Cal Renewal Report.

REFUGEE SUPPORT SERVICES

- The County of San Diego receives federal funding from the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) via the CA Department of Social Services (CDSS) Refugee Program Bureau (RPB) to provide employment services that assist refugees resettled in the region to achieve the goal of self-sufficiency through employment.
 - OIRA Director serves as County Refugee Coordinator
 - County submits a Refugee Employment Services plan to the State every three years.
 - RPB allocates funds to the County for Employment Services (English classes, job training, resume building, etc.).
 - In 2022, the County received an additional \$2 million for Afghan Refugee Support Services to support housing navigation, behavioral health, and social, emotional and cultural support programs.





WELCOME CENTERS

- Serve as central resource hubs for community members
- Collected stakeholder input in preparation for development of Welcome Centers
- First Welcome Center opened in March 2022 (Located at South Region FRC National City)
 - Current partners: San Ysidro Health, Alliance for African Assistance, Jewish Family Services,
 Bilateral Safety Corridor Coalition and SBCS.
 - Services provided by partners: employment, child well-being, health education, family wellness,
 Know Your Rights presentations, legal assistance, nutrition services (WIC), resettlement, and other services.



Public Charge Concerns

According to the federal government: a noncitizen who is deemed likely to become a *public charge* (likely to become primarily dependent on the government for subsistence), can be denied admission or lawful permanent residence (known as a green card).

Q: Which public benefits does USCIS consider when determining whether an applicant is inadmissible under the public charge ground?

A: We consider an applicant's current and/or past receipt of public cash assistance for income maintenance. Public cash assistance for income maintenance includes only the following:

- Supplemental Security Income (SSI);
- Cash assistance under the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program; and
- State and local cash assistance programs that provide benefits for income maintenance (often called "General Assistance" programs).

We also consider an applicant's institutionalization for long-term care at government expense, such as in a nursing home or mental health institution.

However, relatively few applicants will be both subject to the public charge ground of inadmissibility and eligible for these public benefits prior to adjustment of status. (For more details, see below under "Most Noncitizens Are Not Eligible for Public Benefits.")

Q: What public assistance programs does USCIS not consider?

A: Generally, we do not consider noncash benefits in making public charge determinations. The only noncash benefit we consider is long-term institutionalization at government expense. We also do not consider special-purpose cash assistance that is not intended for income maintenance.

Public Charge Resources | USCIS

Q: Who is exempt from the public charge ground of inadmissibility?

A: The following noncitizens are exempt from the public charge ground of inadmissibility when applying for visas, admission, or adjustment of status:

- · Asylees and refugees;
- · Amerasian immigrants at admission;
- Afghan and Iraqi interpreters or Afghan or Iraqi nationals employed by or on behalf of the U.S. government;
- · Cuban and Haitian entrants at adjustment of status;
- Applicants seeking adjustment under the Cuban Adjustment Act;
- Nicaraguans and other Central Americans who are adjusting status to legal permanent resident;
- · Haitians who are adjusting status to legal permanent resident;
- · Lautenberg parolees;
- Special immigrant juveniles;
- Applicants for registry;
- Applicants seeking Temporary Protected Status;
- Certain nonimmigrant ambassadors, ministers, diplomats, and other foreign government officials, and their families:
- Human trafficking victims (T nonimmigrants);
- Victims of qualifying criminal activity (U nonimmigrants);







Supporting Asylum Seekers

Lifting of Title 42

- During COVID, Title 42, a part of U.S. health law, prohibited entry of most asylum seekers into the US, it expired on May 11, 2023.
- HSEC-OIRA convened a meeting with Federal, State, and local government officials, NGOs, CBOs, and other key stakeholders on March 29, 2023 to identify actions to support and asylum seekers when arriving in the County.
- Three workgroups emerged: Centralized Intake Coordination, Emergency Shelter, Interim Housing & Respite Shelter, & Medical Screenings, Care and Emergency Services.



Dear Chairwoman Vargas,

I am writing to you on behalf of the Social Services Advisory Board (SSAB). Over the last year, San Diego County's Health and Human Services Agency, Self-Sufficiency Services, has been receiving an increased number of reports of Electronic Benefit Transaction (EBT) theft. Residents accessing Public Safety Net Programs including food assistance (CalFresh), as well as cash assistance (CalWORKs and General Relief), receive their monthly benefits on EBT cards. Unfortunately, thousands of customers per month fall victim to EBT skimming and scamming that occurs when their benefits are unlawfully taken or used from their EBT cards.

Self-Sufficiency Services is committed to replacing benefits for customers as quickly as possible and over the last year has replaced millions of dollars in benefits, however, this issue is impacting several households who fall victim to theft as they are not able to meet their basic needs. The ability to replace stolen benefits for residents quickly is vital to ensuring that households are able to continue meeting their basic needs on a monthly basis. Current State Regulation requires replacement of lost benefits due to electronic theft; however current State Law does not include this requirement.

Assembly Bill (AB) 843 would codify the current State Regulation into State Law and would require the replacement of benefits due to electronic theft. It is essential that the State of California take steps towards implementing benefit replacement as a permanent process, codified by state law. For the reasons indicated above, we request San Diego County actively support AB 843. As Chair of the SSAB, I am writing to recommend that the San Diego Board of Supervisors actively support this request.

SUPPORT: ADDRESSING FOOD SECURITY AND PROTECTING SNAP INTEGRITY

Food insecurity remains both a national problem and an ongoing crisis for San Diego County. While food insecurity rates stabilized after immediate rises following the COVID-19 pandemic, emergency increases to Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits were vital lifelines that kept thousands of San Diegans from hunger. However, as part of ongoing negotiations to extend summer feeding programs for children, Congress agreed to end the emergency SNAP allotments nationwide in March. Since then, food banks across the country and the region have seen an increase in the number of those seeking food assistance. In San Diego County, food pantries have seen a 10 percent increase in seniors seeking food assistance. As Congress deliberates over the reauthorization of the Farm Bill later this year, addressing rising rates of food insecurity should be a top priority. The EATS Act (H.R. 3183), the Senior Hunger Prevention Act (H.R. 3474), and the SNAP Theft Prevention Act together will reduce barriers to access for two populations that are disproportionately impacted by food insecurity and will help those who have had their SNAP benefits stolen by card skimmers.

House of Representatives Bill 3183 (H.R. 3183), authored by Representative Jimmy Gomez (CA-34), would make it easier for college students to access vital nutrition assistance as long as they are enrolled in any recognized school training program or institution of higher education. Barriers to SNAP access for college students create further hardship and can lead to poorer educational outcomes, at a time when 39 percent of community college students and 29 percent of four-year college students are considered food insecure.

House of Representatives Bill 3474 (H.R. 3474), authored by Representative Suzanne Bonamici (OR-1), would make it easier for seniors to access SNAP and reduce costs for seniors to receive basic benefits. A recent report from Feeding America found that 5 million older adults are food insecure, while three out of every five seniors who are eligible for food assistance do not access SNAP. This legislation would simplify the cumbersome application process for seniors, increase outreach efforts to seniors, increase the monthly minimum benefit for seniors, and provide funds to increase outreach efforts to older adults and grandparent caregivers.

House of Representative Bill 205 (H.R. 205), authored by Representative Dutch Ruppersberger (MD-2), would direct SNAP issuing agencies to identify benefits that have been stolen from recipients and also provide a mechanism for reissuing stolen benefits. This would rectify a longstanding issue that prohibits USDA from using federal funds to reimburse recipients. The California Department of Social Services believes nearly \$40 million in SNAP benefits have been stolen since August 2022, which is often caused by placing card skimmer devices at ATMs or in stores. The lack of security devices such as security chips or tap-to-pay functions that increase card security make EBT cards an easy target for these skimmers. This legislation would also direct USDA to examine various security enhancements for EBT cards. This compliments

advocacy efforts at the State level we have engaged in on this matter as EBT theft is a significant burden to both our clients and County operations.

Support of these bills is authorized by the Board's approval of the Legislative Program Priority Issues, which calls for the County of San Diego to actively engage in legislation at the state and federal level to ensure such legislation benefits County operations and the clients, customers, and constituents we serve in the area of Equity and Justice as well as the Legislative Program Policy Guidelines (Section II.L.1.), which calls for support of legislation that expand access to affordable and nutritious food.

In accordance with Board Policy M-2, I have authorized the County's Washington D.C. Representatives to convey the County's support of H.R. 3183, H.R. 3474, and H.R. 205 to the appropriate members of Congress and the Administration.

 - Initial application and recertification interviews March 31st 2024

 - Able Bodied Adults Without Dependents CA waiver extended through October 31, 2024
 - This is a new <u>two-year</u> waiver based on 36 months of unemployment data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics from the period of August 2019 July 2022
 - Reinstatement waiver extended from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2027

EBT Theft continues, San Diego County testified at April 27th Senate Budget Committee Hearing

Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023

- Temporary college student exemptions expired at end of federal PHE effective June 10th
 - 30-day phase out for new applicants
 - Current recipients will be evaluated for exemptions during the recertification process
- Emergency Allotments
 - . Last allotment was issued on March 26th
 - The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 discontinued Emergency Allotment issuances effective April 1st
 - The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) provided a mass mailer and multiple robocall/texting campaign to inform recipients
 - The County also provided multiple communications to inform recipients including a robocall/text campaign, and website updates

CALWORKS OVERVIEW



PROGRAM FLEXIBILITIES & WAIVERS

- Executive Order N-71-20 signed on June 30, 2020 extends the following provisions until the EO is rescinded or the state of emergency ends:
 - Telephonic/verbal signature on application extended permanently
 - Flexibilities on identity and pregnancy verifications **extended permanently**
- Initial application interview waiver has expired, interviews for new applications resumed effective December 1, 2021
- Pregnancy Special Need amount increased from \$47 to \$100
- Pregnant applicants can now qualify for CalWORKs during any trimester
- Time on Aid increased from 48 to 60 months

Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 Changes:

- Ending of Public Health Emergency and Continuous Eligibility
