Registrar of Voters (ROV)

Guest Speaker: Rosie Rascon, Coordinator, Volunteer & Public Services for ROV

Purpose of presentation is to share how ROV is ensuring that voting is accessible. ROV is always looking for feedback and they already have a Voter Accessibility Advisory Committee.

All county residents have the right to vote. San Diego County ROV provides:

Accessible Voting

- All San Diego County residents will receive a ballot by mail automatically
 - Voting by mail offers privacy and security
 - o Return envelopes with paid postage are included
 - o Ballots can also be dropped off at a drop-off location
 - o Ballots can also be dropped off at any County vote centers
- Remote Accessible Vote by Mail (RAVBM)
 - Any voter may request and receive access to a Remote Accessible Vote by Mail System.
 This system allows you to download and complete a ballot electronically from home. After

completion, you can print and return/drop off the ballot.

- This option is available to any voter but must be requested, it is not automatic.
- Accessible Ballot Marking Devices: every vote center will have accessible ballot marking devices that are fully compliant with the ADA.
 - o These are accessible 29 days before Election Day
- Assistance at Vote Centers: 1-2 people such as a family member, friend or poll worker can assist you at the vote center to cast your vote.
- Vote Center and Ballot Drop Box Location Accessibility
 - Vote centers and drop boxes are selected using ADA guidelines and the Secretary of State's accessibility checklist.
- Curbside Voting: anyone who cannot physically access a vote center may request to vote curbside and a poll worker will come outside to assist.
 - Arrangements can be made by calling 858-565-5800
- Voter Accessibility Advisory Committee is available for feedback or participation
- Translation and language assistance can be coordinated by calling 858-565-5800
- ROV has an in person and online survey available for persons with disabilities to provide feedback
- Voting centers have physical accommodations including ramps and additional accessible parking
- Language assistance is available for those who don't speak English as their primary language

Committee Recommendations:

- Post ADA assistance signs for easy direction
- On posted resources, include information on transportation assistance
- Mobile vote centers
- Additional ADA training for Poll Workers and Volunteers
