Speakers for the US Navy regarding the use of the Descanso Detention Facility for USN SEAL Training:

Anna Shepard , AlČP , Navy Base Coronado Community Plans and Liaison Officer Lt Jack Brodowicz, Officer in Charge of this proposed SEAL Operation Bill Norman, Contractor VATC

- US Navy is entering into an Agreement with the County of San Diego for the use of the Old Detention Facility (DF) on Old Ranch Rd., Alpine
- This site was chosen because it is not known to their team members and will
  replicate the mission training in a more realistic way.
- 2022-2027 is span of contract
- 4 times a year, 2 days in a row is 2 events, each event is apx a 5-hour time period in the evening at around sunset. The time frame is 2 in June and 2 in October
- Up to 2 helicopters will depart 25 members and then return to retrieve them.
- Would use the I-8 corridor for the approach and cross over into the DF which is adjacent to the freeway
- Other than small door (simulated) explosives, no live fire will occur
- Helicopter types would be 60' (that hold 10-12 persons). No Osprey type helicopters
- All activity will occur within the fenced perimeter of the DF property
- Range officers would be on site to reduce risk and manage operation
- Descanso Fire Department will be on site during operation
- Notification to nearby residents via door hangers of pending operation

# Member and audience comments

- Sound impacts to livestock, especially horses
- Sound impacts to livestock should not be a problem as we have a lot of helicopter noise already (military, SDGE, Fire, etc.).
- What are projected sound impacts? Especially while landing.
- Incompatible use to the National Forest
- Would like to see final agreement
- Has Alpine Planning Group been notified?
- Helicopter impacts to wildlife, nesting birds in June
- Land Use Issues. This site is not zoned for this type of use. Check General Plan, It does not include this type of use.
- Use Gillespie Field or Mt Laguna or other sites

- Horse impacts: horse are afraid of things coming down on them, they are a prey animal.
- Aircraft noise has been increasing in community and this should not be allowed. Lots of Military Helicopters and Ospreys from Miramar and North Island fly over daily to El Centro and Yuma, low and loud.
- Can't trust government to do what they say they are going to do, will stay longer and have more frequent exercises
- Seal Team can use their La Posta facility or Barrett Lake site
- There are low power lines which cross over I 8 near the DF, could snag a helicopter and shut off our power, possible fire
- Extremely High Santa Anna Winds in October should be considered in operations, could down a helicopter, possible fire risk
- Cell Tower at the western edge of DF, Don't Hit IT, possible fire risk and shut off cell service to the area
- This site will not be used exclusively by Navy, Other uses of the facility could occur. Navy use would be only 4 times in a year, 2 nights in a row per exercise

### **DCPG Chair Recommendations:**

- Review General Plan and Descanso Community Plan to verify this is a listed use for this facility, compatible with community character
- One on one communication, USN a with those residents impacted to alert them as to the pending exercise. To ensure time for resident to make accommodations with their livestock, for the benefit of all impacted during the 4 evening events.
- The community should have a meeting with Navy for "Lessons Learned" following the first event of 2 evenings with impacted residents.
