13. COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM

<u>In Review:</u> Our planning group would like to participate in this program and eventually build an outdoor park and recreation area. Parks and Recreation has accumulated about a <u>half a</u> <u>million dollars</u> that is available to us. These funds come from housing development fees.

Dan Neirinckx announced that the deadline for Grant submissions at this November 30^t. The minimum request is \$3,500. We could apply for the maximum grant for a park here in Jamul but selecting a piece of land to purchase is still the problem. The parcel that SDGE purchase for a substation off Proctor Valley Road and Maxfield Road could be possible. The site is unusable for a substation as it there was too much interference with a phone ground. It is now used for storage. We could ask for a donation or buy it. We also have to maintain it and we need money after we but it. We need to decide what we want and present a plan for what we are doing and Parks and Rec need to agree to it.

Michael Casinelli said in 2016 our group asked them to donate the land. No decision was made. Hilton Head Park off Willow Glen is a good example of an outdoor park.
