My husband and I are senior residents living in the Hidden Meadows community. We moved here 17 years ago and were 'sold' on the rural character of the area such as little traffic congestion, the vast presence of wildlife, good air quality and many other great features of a more rural area. We are opposed to the Newland Sierra proposed development for the following reasons:

Concern for the adverse effect to the health and welfare of our residents during the construction process—blasting and breaking of boulders, and dust and noise over a lengthy period of time. We have many seniors living in and around the proposed construction area with pulmonary/respiratory problems which would be further exacerbated by the effects of this project.
