Imperial Valley Desert Museum

2019 Fact Sheet

- IVDMS, Inc. has been serving the communities of Imperial Valley for 45 years, since its incorporation as Imperial Valley College Desert Museum Society, Inc. in 1974.
- Local planning for the Imperial Valley Desert Museum began in 1984, when IVC accepted a plan presented by the Imperial Valley Desert Museum Society, Inc.
- A local, grass-roots fundraising effort built the museum and continues to support the museum.
- The Museum is the only approved federal curation facility in the Imperial Valley and stewards over 30,000 artifacts associated with at least 10,000 years of habitation and culture in the desert.
- In partnership with KDLC, IVDMS, Inc. stewards over 100 acres of land under conservation easement around its facility in Ocotillo, CA.
- IVDMS, Inc. Board of Directors consists of 11 seats, with 2 currently occupied by members of Kumeyaay Nation. It has 2 vacancies, with its Nominating Committee now actively reviewing candidates.
- The Museum partners with regional agencies to bring arts and cultural experiences to the communities of Imperial Valley and eastern San Diego County. Most recently:
 - IC Probation Department: Juvenile Hall & Work Service Program (2017-current)
 - Mountain Empire School District: Title VII "History on the Go!" (2018-current)
- In 2017/18, 3,876 students were reached through our Education programs.
- In 2019, IVDM will begin providing temporary art exhibits in public places across Imperial County (CHS9 library).
