- Data through November 30 2024
- Contracts to administer permanent housing subsidies were executed in May 2024 and will begin transitioning people from emergency housing into permanent housing in July 2024.
- County (HSEC) administers grant in Unincorporated and on behalf of Santee and Caltrans.
- City of SD will administer all services for their portion of grant. City received funding via sub-recipient grant agreement in May 2024 and is facilitating services; City of San Diego data not included here.
